- STM 2024 Annual Report
 - Matt Yarrow and Laura Lee Sturm presenting
 - 0.15% sales tax from April 2021 - March 2027
 - ~\$50M/year raised
 - Transit ridership levels are at 72% of pre-Covid levels
 - Ridership in off-peak times has rebounded faster than during peak times
 - Spring 2025 - Saturday and Sunday are at and at more of ridership in 2019
 - Frequent Transit Network (FTN) updated in 2024 as part of STP to have same level of frequency regardless of day of the week
 - Transit service investments
 - Funded ~3000 additional weekly bus trips
 - Only 15% of these trips were during AM/PM peak times
 - Other 85% is midday, evenings, nights, weekends
 - Other transit investments
 - Seattle Streetcar - city-owned asset
 - STM funded \$10.2 million to cover operations and maintenance costs
 - Streetcar ridership increasing by 6% to total of ~1.5 million drivers
 - Delridge/South Park Metro Flex Pilot
 - On demand transit shuttle service launched in July 2024
 - Close to 9k rides in first 5 months of operation
 - Transportation Access Program
 - Support Low-income and no-income residents with ORCA subsidy programs
 - Downtown Circulator for first hill and downtown
 - Different education programs as well
 - Transit Capital Projects
 - Capital spending was at \$15.2 million in 2024
 - Helped support RapidRide G Line and J Line
 - Transit corridors, safe access to transit, transit operations and reliability, and spot improvements
 - Emerging Needs
 - Mainly for Covid and West Seattle Bridge Closure. Not as applicable now
 - In 2024, \$1M proviso for transit ambassadors on KCM bus routes and Streetcar
 - Transit GO App Rewards Program

- 16k of additional service hours to be invested as part of Lynnwood Link Service REcovery Project
 - Continue to support THD and Streetcar
 - Updated branding for Downtown Circulator
 - Questions
- Roosevelt-Pinehurst Way NE Paving & Safety Project
 - Pavement preservation project with federal grant funding
 - Complete Streets ordinance is triggered
 - What we've heard
 - Top priorities are improving safety, adding crosswalks, and repairing sidewalks
 - Barriers to Taking the Bus
 - Bus does not come frequently enough
 - Bus routes not direct
 - Lack of shelter at bus stops
 - Project Scope
 - Restore pavement
 - Upgrade bike lanes from sharrows to protected lanes
 - Redesign key intersections
 - No Turn on Red and Leading Pedestrian Intervals
 - Upgrade bus stops with integrated lighting, in lane stops
 - Enhanced crossings at bus stops
 - Bus Stop Consolidation
 - Must meet current stop spacing guidelines, improve operation, and have safe crossings
