A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY IS COMING TO YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD!

The following street improvements on NE 135th St from 20th Ave NW to 27th Ave NE will begin as soon as spring 2024:

- · Tree trimming if needed
- All-way stop signs installed where 20th Ave NE and 27th Ave NE intersect NE 135th St
- Speed humps or cushions to calm traffic
- Wayfinding signs and markings

We are excited to announce that we are starting construction on the Olympic Hills Neighborhood Greenway on NE 135th St as soon as spring 2024! We will be installing the Neighborhood Greenway in stages, starting this spring and finishing in 2024.

There will be "no parking" signs along this street due to construction of speed humps and staging. Please move your vehicles during the "no parking" timeframes, otherwise they will be towed.







Overview

The Olympic Hills Neighborhood Greenway will provide a safer, calmer route to the places people want to go in the neighborhood and connect to the growing network of Neighborhood Greenways, trails, and protected bike lanes in Seattle. This Neighborhood Greenway has been planned in coordination with the Safe Routes to School Program and will provide a safer, more comfortable route for people walking and biking to Olympic Hills Elementary School as well as connect to the Cedar Park Elementary Safe Route to School on NE 135th St.

WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY?

Neighborhood Greenways are safer, calmer residential streets for you, your family, and neighbors. We make people walking and biking the priority. The Olympic Hills Neighborhood Greenway will include speed humps or cushions to calm traffic, all-way stop signs installed where 20th Ave NE and 27th Ave NE intersect NE 135th St, tree trimming if needed, and wayfinding signs and markings.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:

Typical construction hours are weekdays, 7 AM to 5 PM, with occasional weekend and night work. Other expected construction effects may include:

- Temporary driveway impacts
- Noise and vibration
- Dust and debris
- Construction staging and parking impacts near the work sites
- Parking impacts
- Crosswalk and sidewalk closures, and detours for people walking and biking
- Roadway closures and detours for vehicle traffic
- Changes in construction schedule due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., weather, soil conditions, etc.)
