# GREENWOOD AVE N PAVING AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROJECT

July 2019

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is planning to repave a section of Greenwood Ave N, as well as construct a new sidewalk and pedestrian crossing. These improvements will help achieve Seattle's Vision Zero goal to end all traffic deaths and serious injuries by 2030.

## PROJECT ELEMENTS

The first phase of the project included new sidewalk, planting strip, curb and gutter along the east side of Greenwood Ave N, between N 137th St and N 145th St. Crews also installed a new pedestrian-activated traffic signal at N 137th St.

Other improvements included Americans with Disabilities Act-compliant curb ramps at each intersection in the project area and pedestrian signal improvements at N 143rd and N 145th streets.

The second phase of the project will repave the roadway surface and construct a new sidewalk, planting strip, curb and gutter along the west side of Greenwood Ave N, between N 136th St and N 145th St.

## SCHEDULE AND FUNDING

The first phase of construction was completed in December 2018.

Construction on the second phase will begin in August 2019. Crews will complete pedestrian safety improvements on the west side of Greenwood Ave N in fall 2019 before returning in spring 2020 to complete the weather-dependent roadway paving.

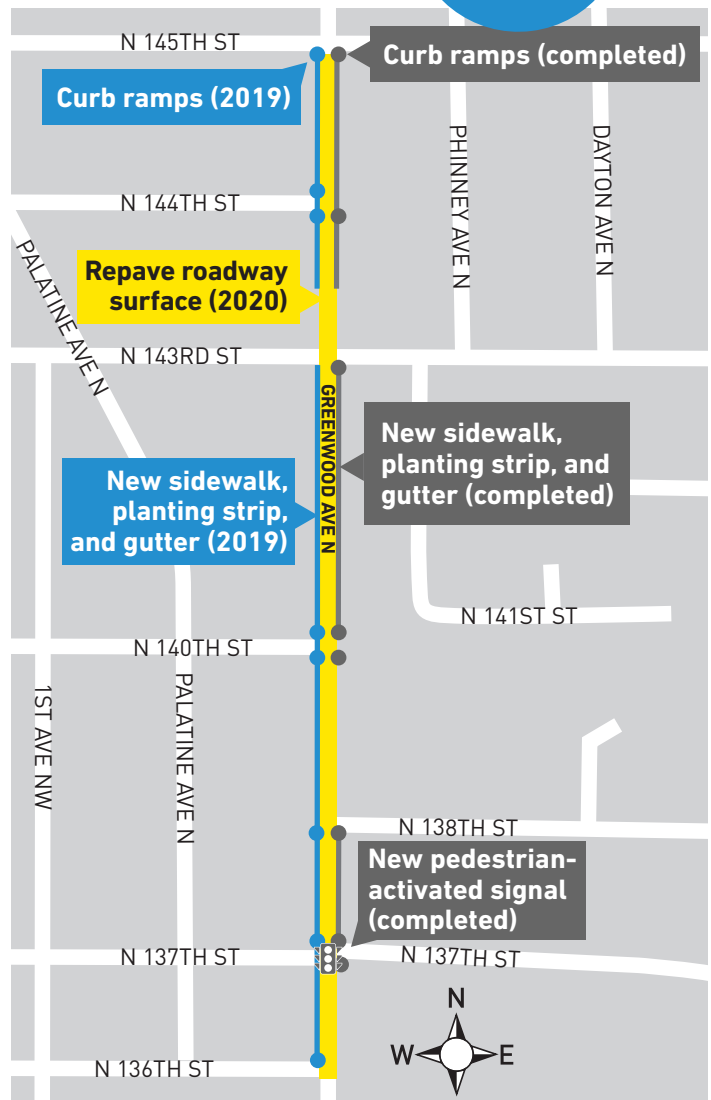
This project is funded by the Safe Routes to School Program, the Sidewalk Development Program, and the 9-year Levy to Move Seattle, approved by voters in 2015.
