Home Zone

What is it? A holistic and cost-effective approach to encouraging slower vehicle speeds and making residential streets more walkable within a neighborhood. Examples:

- Traffic circles
- Speed humps
- Stay Healthy Streets
- Cost-effective walkways
- Activation and beautification
- Treatments coordinated with other City departments



Home Zone - Process

1. Determine the concern
2. Identify and discuss possible solutions
3. Identify possible funding
 1. Home Zone Funding (~\$200,000)
 2. Neighborhood Matching Fund
 1. Small Sparks - \$5,000
 2. Community Partnerships Fund - \$50,000
 3. Your Voice Your Choice (< \$150,000)
 4. Neighborhood Street Fund (\$100K - \$1million)
4. Design
5. Implement



Home Zone- Tools

- **Quick and Fun (couple months)**
 - Block Party/Play Streets
 - Placemaking and Neighborhood Livability
- **Larger Projects (one year)**
 - Traffic Calming
 - Pedestrian Improvements
- **Comprehensive (2+ years)**
 - Traffic Diverters



Home Zone- Quick & Fun Tools

- **Block Party/Play Streets**
 - Block Party
 - Play Street
- **COST: FREE!**



Home Zone- Quick & Fun Tools

- **Placemaking and Neighborhood Livability**
 - Yard Signs - FREE
 - Little Free library/pantry - \$5-\$150
 - Trees - FREE
 - Traffic Signal Artwork - \$500+
 - Painted Intersections - \$2,000-\$5,000
 - Bike Racks - \$0-\$5,000
 - P-Patch Garden- Sign up Free!
 - Parklets- \$15,000-\$50,000
- **Note: all permits are FREE!**



Home Zone- Larger Projects

- **Traffic Calming**
 - Parking - FREE
 - Speed humps, cushions - \$5,000
 - Speed table - \$10,000
 - Traffic Circles - \$20,000-\$25,000



Home Zone- Larger Projects

- **Pedestrian Improvements**
 - **Wheel Stops- \$15K-\$30K**
 - **Planting Strips- \$15K-\$40K**
 - **Walkway Surface - \$20K-\$60K**
 - **Painted Curb Bulbs- \$5K - \$20K**



Home Zone- Comprehensive

- **Traffic Diverters**
 - Partial Street Closure - \$5K - \$25K
 - Diagonal Diverter - \$5K-\$25K
 - One Way Couplet - \$3K-\$5K



Home Zone Timeline

- ***April - June 2021***

- SDOT to present draft home zone proposal and present to community
- Collect additional concerns from neighborhood representatives and feedback on draft home zone
- Design outreach strategies with community stakeholders
- Implement some priority projects

- ***July - September 2021***

- Complete traffic studies
- Implement community outreach strategies to collect resident feedback on specific projects
- Finalize home zone plan

- ***October – December 2021***

- Design priority projects

- ***2022 -***

- Implement priority projects
- Continue neighborhood collaboration on long-term improvements

- ***April - June 2021***

- Engage community in developing a Home Zone
 - Develop Home Zone Steering Committee
 - Present Home Zone Proposal at Steering Committee Meeting
 - April 28th, 7:00 PM
- Develop Outreach strategies with Steering Committee
 - Review and add members to Steering Committee
 - Determine Steering Committee Scope of Work
 - Set Community meeting/s and Neighborhood walks
- Schedule Additional Community Walking Tours
 - Identify additional community concerns
 - Get feedback on proposed projects
