

11th Ave NW Access and Habitat Improvements Project Overview

Description

We are making improvements to the 11th Avenue Northwest shoreline street end located at 4301R 11th Ave NW. The project will protect the shoreline from erosion and improve visual public access to the shore.

The existing decking at the 11th Ave NW shoreline street end was designed and built by University of Washington Landscape Architecture Students in 2015. In 2019, we installed some temporary erosion control measures. The deck has been heavily battered by time and the shore continues to be severely eroded by wakes in this busy section of the Lake Washington Ship Canal.

To resolve these issues, we propose to make the following improvements:

- Installation of erosion and sediment control measures with preference for soft shore armoring such as anchored logs
- Installation of salmonoid habitat gravel placement along shoreline
- Installation of additional native landscape plantings
- Potentially remove existing decking and replace it with a plaza and overlook
- Potentially upgrade existing gravel pathway to hardscaping for better accessibility

So far, we have completed a survey of the site and kicked off the design process. Our current estimate is that these changes will be completed in either the summer or autumn of 2023. As details of this project become available, we will share information with the community.
