

Project need

Wedgwood Elementary parents and neighbors and SDOT are working together to:

- Improve the safety of the walking and biking route to school
- Connect Wedgwood Elementary to the existing sidewalk network south of the school
- Repair and connect sidewalk on Ravenna Ave NE to the new sidewalk network
- Provide safety education to kids so they have the skills to safely walk and bike to school
- Encourage more kids to walk and bike to school


Key project elements

Phase 1: Summer to Fall 2015


- New sidewalk on NE 85th Street
- New sidewalk on 28th Avenue NE from NE 83rd Street to NE 85th Street

Phase 2: Early 2016

- Repair or replace sidewalk on Ravenna Avenue NE
- New sidewalk on NE 83rd Street
- New sidewalk on 28th Avenue NE from NE 82nd Street to NE 83rd Street



Schedule and funding



Project funding sources:

- Local funding \$1.1 million
- Washington Department of Transportation \$400 K

Temporary impacts during construction

- Noise
- Pedestrian and vehicle detours around work areas
- Access to properties, with advanced notification
- Driveway closures
- Parking restrictions



