Safety improvements coming to Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden St

We're making safety improvements for people walking and rolling at the Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden St intersection.

This work will include:

EXISTING

- A new durable traffic signal with traffic cameras to monitor and adjust the signal in real-time
- Rebuilding all four corners of the intersection with new American with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible concrete curb ramps and curb bulbs
- Painting permanent crosswalks at each crossing
- Permanent artwork

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Work will begin as soon as June and last approximately until early 2024.
- Work will occur on weekdays between 7 AM and 4 PM.
- Shifting lane closures.
- Initially, parking will not be allowed on the west side on SW Holden St while potholing work is being completed.
- Crosswalk re-routing may be in place.
- We will notify neighbors of temporary driveway closures during the work.
- Typical construction equipment, materials, noise, dust, vibration and activity in the work area.
