



## Night work on October 30: Highland Park Way SW & SW Holden St Safety Improvements

### WHAT'S HAPPENING

We are removing the existing traffic marking and painting new ones at the Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden St intersection. This process requires special equipment that is noisy, and we will be working outside our normal construction hours.

### WHEN

Monday, October 30 | 7 PM – 5 AM

Please note: This work is weather and temperature dependent, so we may need to shift the date.

### WHAT TO EXPECT

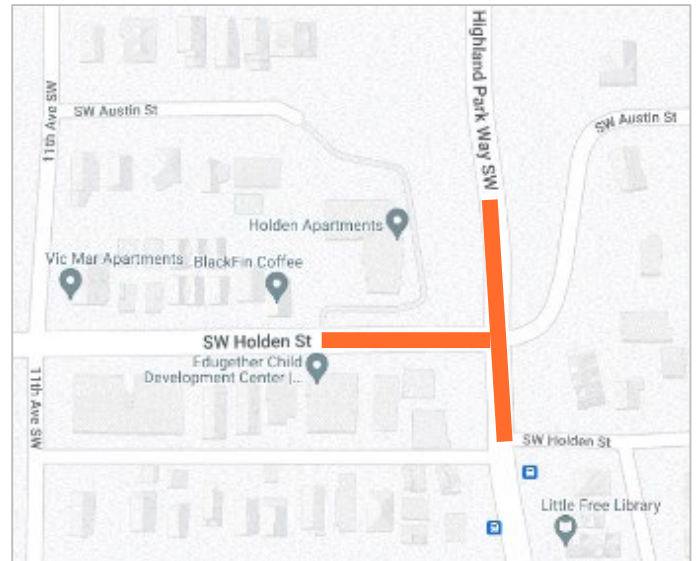
We will be running equipment that sounds like a giant vacuum, but no vibration or banging is expected. Noisy work will be done by 10 PM.

Alternating traffic lanes will also be closed, but there will always be one lane open for cars to get through.

### WHAT'S NEXT

Most of the construction for this project is complete. Over the new few months, we will:

- **Install a new public art piece** in early November. More information on this soon!
- **Install permanent metal traffic signals and poles** at the Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden St intersection in December or January. You may have noticed there are orange barrels at the four corners of the intersection. These are protecting the exposed anchor bolts for the future poles.



Work will take place at and near the Highland Park Way SW and SW Holden Street intersection.
