

2020/2021: Community Engagement & Public Outreach



- An online citywide survey in **2020** about Keep Moving Streets & Stay Healthy Streets received 9,277 responses
 - # of responses from SW Seattle zip codes: 2,995
- In **Fall 2021** an online survey was conducted specifically about the final three options for Alki Point KMS:
 - 2,050 respondents took the survey with a majority either living in the neighborhood (58%) and/or using the street for recreation (64%)
 - The survey was available in **nine languages**
 - While 45% traveled through or visited daily, 1/5 came no more than 2 times each month
 - When they visit, 65% get to the street by driving, 56% by walking, 41% by bicycling, or 21% by running
