
# WELCOME

### Project Overview

We are repaving Roosevelt Way NE and Pinehurst Way NE between NE 92nd St and 15th Ave NE to extend the life of the roadway by 10 to 20 years. Along with resurfacing the asphalt, we will be making important infrastructure upgrades, such as fixing the road base, installing curb ramps that meet ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) standards, and improving drainage systems.

In addition to restoring the infrastructure, we are proposing new crosswalks, upgraded bike lanes, and improved bus stops to make the street safer and more accessible for all.

### Background

The roadway has experienced wear and tear, impacting vehicle, pedestrian, and bicycle travel. Resurfacing and repairing the road will help prevent further damage and lower long-term maintenance costs. Addressing safety and connectivity along this corridor will also help meet the goals outlined in the Seattle Transportation Plan (STP) and Vision Zero Action Plan.

#### Schedule

Design began in winter 2024 and is scheduled for completion in spring of 2026. Construction is scheduled to begin as soon as 2027.























