


- ► The Problem: Storm water makes our sewers overflow and pollute our waterways






#### Cisterns Slow the Flow






Working with Owners

- Project costs vs. rebate amounts
  - rebate (\$3.50/sf) is 88 % of original \$4/sf
  - labor costs up
  - costs of all materials, soil, plants, mulch have increased
  - project costs are usually more than the rebate amount. Will your client be okay with that?

- ▶ Vendor pass through (business gives the customer a 2-3 month "loan" and the contractor submits all of the paperwork to RainWise. Then the contractor is paid in 6-8 weeks.
- We get some requests in which the client says that the project can't go over the rebate amount and they have to have a "VPO" or vendor pass through.
- Can you do the project within that budget?
- Can your cash flow handle that request?
