2. Agenda/Minutes

a. September 5, 2024 minutes were approved 6-0.

4. New Business

a. **SPU's Government Relations Program:** SPU's Susan Saffery gave an overview of SPU's government relations program which works with city, state, federal, tribal, and regional governments and agencies to advance the goals of SPU and key partners including wholesale water customers. The program covers all of SPU's Lines of Business however Susan highlighted SPU's drinking water advocacy elements. A special mention was made regarding Slide 13 and current funding available via the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund.

b. Impact on Water Utilities by HBs 1337 (ADUs) & 1110 (Middle Housing): Boyd Benson (City of Bothell Utilities & Development Services Manager & OB representative) and Leslie Brinson (SPU Senior Policy Advisor) presented on these two bills passed by the WA State Legislature in 2023 that impact water utilities. HB 1337 focuses on accessory dwelling units (ADUs) and HB 1110 focuses on middle housing. Boyd and Leslie provided an overview of the bills, an explanation of how they impact water utilities, and shared Bothell & Seattle's experiences. These bills were aimed at supporting affordable housing, however they may not have fully considered the impacts on water utilities. Water utilities are encouraged to engage with their local land use planning agency to guide their implementation. Alex Chen then facilitated a group discussion regarding how others are planning to respond. The group discussed numerous potential implications including: need to re-examine policies for services/meters/connection fees, the desire to limit the number of connections to the main to protect main integrity, how this might trigger fire sprinkler requirements, how this could change storage requirements, how this changes traditional demand forecasting, and other topics.

5. Executive Summaries & Other Business

a. Water Consumption from Watersheds vs. Rate Studies: Alex Chen referenced this document. Actual annual consumption to date is 2% higher than the 2020 Rate Study projection and 2% lower than this time last year.

b. **Water Supply Update:** SPU's Julie Crittenden acknowledged the start of the new water year and shared that water supply is looking good.

c. **Other Updates:** None.

d. **Next Meeting:** November 4 – Virtual only on Teams; 1-3pm. Kelly O'Rourke mentioned she is starting to plan the 2025 meetings and at this meeting she will ask for input on the preferred mix of formats (in person, virtual, hybrid), as well as discuss the May meeting which conflicts with two conferences.

6. Good of the Order

a. **Fluoride:** Alex Chen mentioned that a recent decision in a federal court case in California regarding fluoride means that EPA is obliged to take regulatory action (although the court did not prescribe what the specific regulatory action should be). SPU will follow these developments.
