Conservation Options – packages of water saving measures to achieve the following water policy and operational considerations

Least utility cost – classic stacking of the most cost-effective conservation measures

Leveraged cost share – seek opportunities to cost share with other utilities, agencies and organizations

Cumlative long-term savings – capture lost opportunties and emerging issues; advocate for efficient standards and codes

Fixed budget – predictable level of program activity

Stepped intensity – program of varying levels over period of years

Indirect benefits – additional savings of energy and reductions of GHG, drainage and wastewater

Certainty of savings – emphasis on attribution of outcomes to investment
