5:45	Land/ Labor Acknowledgment: We are currently occupying the unceded lands of many First Peoples; Coast Salish people, Muckleshoot, Suquamish, Stillaguamish, and Duwamish. We acknowledge and thank local First Nations for their centuries of land stewardship that long predates the arrival of European settlers. We remind you to be aware of the spaces you occupy locally, that these lands were stolen from First People in the name of white settler colonialism and that you seek ways to continue your education and give back to local Indigenous communities. 5:58	Public Comment Tana Yasu states that Domestic Violence Awareness Month is in October, and if there are any DVAM activities or an event, she is interested in providing support.	-
6:01	Subcommittee Updates Reproductive Health The subcommittee is working on a blog post and they have some other action items, including soliciting a speaker and pursuing volunteer opportunities.	-
	Gender-Based Violence The subcommittee is working on bringing in a speaker. The SWC DVPC representative (Veronica) has rolled off; Sonia is interested in this role.	
	Housing Access The subcommittee needs new members as everyone else has rolled off the SWC. Hannah is interested.	
	Communications Emi K. (Coalition for Rights & Safety) shared concerns about SOAP with the 5 Commissions and with the SWC.	
	There was discussion on the proposed Stay Out of Areas of Prostitution (SOAP) and Stay Out of Drug Areas (SODA) legislation, including a review of the August SWC meeting discussion, recent communications and a reminder about the vote scheduled for tomorrow's Council meeting.	

	K. Guerrero makes a motion to approve a SWC statement in opposition to the SOAP and SODA legislation, seconded by H. Glover. Unanimous approval (7 ayes), the motion is passed. Co-Chair Updates There is a reminder to update member information in the SWC Roster. A poll will be shared soon to schedule a December gathering. There was a review of the members who have recently rolled off the SWC. This prompted a question about reinstating the Outreach Committee to prioritize new SWC member recruitment for the coming year and perhaps reducing the workplan/number of subcommittees.
