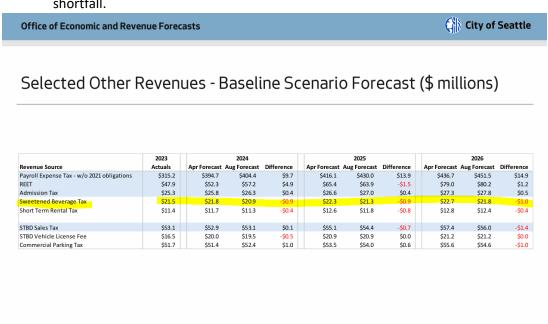

Summary: The purpose of this meeting was for the CAB to receive an update on the August revenue forecast. There were not enough CAB members in attendance for quorum, so no new decisions were made. However, the Executive Committee, which speaks on behalf of the CAB, did decide to send a letter reiterating the CAB's June budget recommendations.

- G. Shiring from the City Budget Office shared information from the <u>August revenue forecast</u>. The main takeaways were:
 - Beginning in 2024, there is a \$900K reduction in SBT revenues from 2024-2026
 - By 2026, with no changes in the SBT Financial Plan, this means there would be a \$1 million shortfall.



City representatives were unable to comment on the scenarios being considered to balance the SBT Fund, but options in situations like this are find another revenue source, reduce expenditures, utilize all the reserves.

After discussing the August revenue forecast, the Executive Committee reviewed the CAB's original 2025 budget recommendations (transmitted on June 5, 2024). The Executive Committee decided to made sense to transmit another letter that reiterated the same points, i.e.:

- Maintain restrictions on the SBT Fund
- Prioritize funding for SBT programs/services
- Look to the future Families & Education levy to fund the early learning programs/services currently funded by SBT.

The meeting adjourned at 10am.
