Persian Spire Parrotia



Soil needs: adaptable

Min. planting strip width: 5 ft.

- Disease and pest resistant
- Kaleidoscope of leaf
- · Upright form great for



Eastern Redbud



Soil needs: adaptable to wide range of soils

Min. planting strip width: 5 ft.

- Disease and pest resistant
- Heart-shaped leaves turn yellow in fall
- Showy pea-like pink flowers

Moonglow Magnolia

Magnolia virginiana 'lim Wilson



ht: 25-30 ft Spread: 10-20 ft

Soil needs: prefers moist but well drained

Min. planting strip

- Disease and pest resistant
- Creamy white flowers with lemony fragrance
- Evergreen leaves are glossy green on top and silver underneath



Chinese Pistache

Pistacia



ight: 35 ft Spread: 25 ft

Soil needs: adaptable

Min. planting strip width: 6 ft.

- Compound green leaves turn striking shades of yellow, orange and red
- Year-round seasonal Tough urban tree



Heritage River Birch

Retula nigra



Soil needs: prefers moist but well drained

Min. planting strip

- width: 6 ft. · Resistant to bronze birch
- Peeling bark is cream in color with orange and salmon highlights
- Lustrous green leaves

Decaf Kentucky Coffee Tree

nocladus dioica



'McKBranched' ht: 50 ft. Sp

Soil needs: adaptable

Min. planting strip width: 8 ft.

- Disease and pest resistant
- Bluish-green doubly compound leaves turn yellow in fall
- Tropical look in summer: rugged look in winter



European Beech





Soil needs: prefers moist but well drained

Min. planting strip width: 8 ft.

- Rich, glossy green leaves
- Smooth bark looks like elephant hide at maturity
- Beech nuts are enjoyed by wildlife



Urban Pinnacle Bur Oak



Soil needs: prefers moist but well drained

Min. planting strip width: 8 ft.

- Disease and pest
- resistant • Upright form with strong central leader
- Glossy green leaves turn yellow in fall








In Your Yard (in limited situations for streets)



Jubilee Alaska Yellow Cedar





Min. planting strip width: 12 ft.

- Disease and pest resistant
- Beautiful weeping habit
- A columnar cultivar of a native tree



Mountain Hemlock



Soil needs: prefers moist but well drained

Min. planting strip width: 6 ft.

- Disease and pest resistant
- Blue green needles arranged spirally around the shoot
- Great PNW native conifer for smaller gardens and rock gardens



Shore Pine

Pinus contorta



moist but well drained soils

Min. planting strip width: 12 ft.

- Mostly problem free Can be susceptible to European pine shoot moth
- · Deep green needles in twisted bundles of two
- NW native with unique form; great for screening

How to Get Your Tree

Evaluate your planting site and this year's tree options. Select the tree best suited for the space.

Under power lines?

Select one of the power line approved trees.

Planting along the street?

Review the minimum planting strip width requirements before selecting your tree.

Backyard space?

Choose the largest tree appropriate for your space.

- Apply for trees online starting in mid-July. Submit your application by August 7th at www.seattle.gov/trees/planting-and-care/ trees-for-neighborhoods*
- Attend a workshop to learn how to plant and care for them. We will then deliver the trees to your home.
- Plant your trees! Stay connected with Trees for Seattle and receive tips and tree care reminders to keep your trees healthy.
