Seattle's new waterfront has a range of vibrant public spaces that reconnect the city to Elliott Bay. The improvements, spanning the waterfront from Pioneer Square to Belltown, feature new park space, enhanced shorelines, viewpoints, public art and improved access including extensive street, sidewalk and bike connections. The waterfront is an actively managed and programmed space, promoting recreation, arts, education, walkability, relaxation and better connections to surrounding neighborhoods. WATERFRONT SEATTLE PROGRAM MAP DETAILS

The [Waterfront Seattle Program area](#) spans largely along Alaskan Way from South King Street to Virginia Street, along Elliott Way from Pine Street to Bell Street, along Elliott Avenue and Western Avenue from Blanchard Street to Bell Street, and along Railroad Way from South King Street to Occidental Avenue South. The following list of projects and assets are indicated on the project map with their corresponding numbers.

1. [Railroad Way](#) is located along Railroad Way between Alaskan Way South at South King Street and Charles Street at Occidental Avenue South.
2. [New Alaskan Way + Elliott Way](#) is located along Alaskan Way between South King Street and Virginia Street and along Elliott Way between Alaskan Way (near Pine Street) and Bell Street and is noted on the map between South Jackson Street and South Main Street.
3. [Pioneer Square East West Pedestrian Improvements](#) are located on South King Street between Alaskan Way South and First Avenue South, South Main Street and S Washington Street between Alaskan Way South and Second Avenue South, Second Avenue South between South Main Street and South Washington Street, and Yesler Way between Alaskan Way and First Avenue. They are noted on the map between South Main Street and South Washington Street.
4. [Pioneer Square Habitat Beach](#) is just west of Alaskan Way South in an area between Pier 48 and Colman Dock.
5. [Columbia Street streetscape improvements](#) are located on Columbia Street between Alaskan Way and First Avenue.
6. [Marion Street Pedestrian Bridge](#) is located on the south side of Marion Street between Alaskan Way and First Avenue.
7. [Seawall rebuild](#) is located on Alaskan Way between Yesler Way and Stewart Street and is noted on the map near Madison Street.
8. [Seneca Street Connection](#) is located along Seneca Street between Alaskan Way and Western Avenue.
9. [Park Promenade](#) is located along Alaskan Way between South Washington Street and Stewart Street and is noted on the map near University Street.
10. [Union Street Pedestrian Bridge](#) is located along Union Street between Alaskan Way and Western Avenue.
11. [Pier 58](#) is located on Puget Sound near Union Street and Alaskan Way.
12. [Bike Path](#) additions and improvements span most of the project area along Alaskan Way between South King Street and Virginia Street, Elliott Way between Alaskan Way (near Pine Street) and Bell Street and Elliott Avenue between Blanchard Steet and Bell Street. The Bike Path is noted on the map near Pike Street.
13. Seattle Aquarium expansion is a related project located west of Alaskan Way between the Pike Street and Pine Street.
14. [Overlook Walk elevated park](#) is located along Alaskan way between Pike Place Market at Stewart Street and Pike Street.
15. [Pike Pine Streetscape and Bicycle Improvements](#) are located on Pine Street between First Avenue and Melrose Avenue and Pike Street between First Avenue and Minor Avenue.
16. [Pier 62](#) is located on Puget Sound near Pine Street and Alaskan Way.
17. Pike Place Market’s MarketFront is a related project located between Elliott Way and Western Avenue, near Stewart Street.
18. [Bell Street Improvements project](#) is located along Bell Street between Elliott Avenue and First Avenue.
19. [Public restroom](#) is located west of Alaskan Way across near Pier 58 and Union Street.
