







Most Common Dispositions








MOST COMMON DISPOSITIONS

FAILURE TO RESPOND POLICY

Historically, this crime has had a disproportionate impact on the City's homeless population. In order to simultaneously address the root of the underlying behavior and the act(s) of incivility, the following filing policy guidelines have been implemented:

The crime of *Failure to Respond to a Notice of Infraction* may be charged under the following circumstances:

- In cases where specific people chronically commit similar infractions under similar circumstances;
- If there is a failure to respond to these infractions;
- If there is a refusal to stop their behavior after repeated attempts (by law enforcement, human services, LEAD, the Crisis Solutions Center, the Mobile Crisis Team, or other agencies, as appropriate) to achieve compliance.
