We are interested in the Summer Learning Programs Request for Investment opportunity for our program, but we're unsure if we are eligible to apply.</p> <p>Our organization is the Center for Workforce Inclusion and Healthcare System Equity (WIHSE) at the University of Washington's School of Medicine - not a Seattle public, private, or charter K-12 school, and we're acting as a community-based organization in our programming to promote underserved communities' youths exploration of and support in pursuing healthcare careers. 2	<p>Question(s):</p> <p>I am not sure what you want, but I will explain what I am doing now.</p> <p>I am a preschool that has been involved in teaching kindergarten skills to children also. During the pandemic I furnished backup support for several kids here at my home daycare helping them to adjust to the new online classes. I currently teach reading skills to 2 boys after school that were failing reading. One took the school reading program and came away with no results. The other one couldn't read and was in first grade. Within 2 months, I had him reading level 2 and now beginning level 3. Both boys seem to have focus problems, one is on medication.</p>	<p>Answer(s):</p> <p>Thank you for your email. I believe my methods for reading and learning suit the children I have been helping more than the schools. I help them blend back in where they should be.</p> <p>Talk to the parents of the children I have helped over the years. 3	<p>Question(s):</p> <p>I was very excited to see the summer RFI released this week, and I look forward to applying on behalf of my organization. I have one question as I get ready to write our proposal.</p> <p>I see that there is a requirement that programs be at least 4 weeks, with at least 20 hours of programming per week. At this point, we have already begun planning and marketing our summer 2024 program, with a plan for it to be three weeks. We plan to offer 35 hours a week of programming, for 105 total program hours. Since this exceeds the minimum of 80 hours of programming required, would we still be eligible for funding? If we are awarded funding, we would be happy to offer four weeks of programming in summer 2025 and 2026, but the challenge for 2024 is that we will have already enrolled students in the program when we find out if our proposal is successful, and so it does not seem fair to them to change the length of the program once they are already enrolled.</p>	<p>Answer(s):</p> <p>Thank you for your email. As stated on page 6 of the Summer RFI, a program must meet both the 4 week and 20 hours per week minimum criteria. For example, a 4 week program at 20 hours per week would equal a total of 80 program hours. 6	<p>Question(s):</p> <p>Your eligibility requirements state that programs must take place for at least four (4) consecutive weeks and no longer than eight (8) weeks between late June and end of August, each year of this RFI, for at least twenty (20) hours per week. Our mentoring program is year-round and our mentors are full-time salaried staff who meet with each individual youth 3-4 hrs per week, but deliver overall services 40 hrs per week. Can you clarify if youth need to participate in programming at least 20 hrs per week and confirm whether our program is eligible to apply?</p>	<p>Answer(s):</p> <p>Thank you for your email.
