

COMMISSIONER SOUGHT FOR SEATTLE ETHICS AND ELECTIONS COMMISSION

The <u>Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission</u> (SEEC) is looking for a candidate to serve in the Commission-appointed Commissioner position.

The SEEC is a seven-member, volunteer body that interprets and administers Seattle's Democracy Voucher Program, as well as the Whistleblower Protection, Ethics, Elections, and Lobbying Codes. The SEEC advises the City Council and the Mayor on promoting ethics in government and appoints and oversees the work of an executive director, who is charged with implementing SEEC decisions. Commissioners act as judges when a person is charged with violating one of the Commission-administered codes, and issue advisory opinions. Through staff, the SEEC publishes guides to the codes it enforces, and conducts educational programs on the Commission-administered codes.

The SEEC meets on the first Wednesday of every month at 4:00 p.m.; occasionally Commissioners need to attend special meetings. Commission members usually spend between two and five hours per month on SEEC business, although the workload may vary.

Commissioners serve three-year terms and may be reappointed. The successful candidate will be selected by the six current Commissioners. The appointee's term will start upon confirmation by the City Council and last until December 31, 2027.

Residency in the City of Seattle, while not required, is an asset. Per <u>Seattle Municipal Code</u> <u>3.70.060</u>, Commissioners cannot be active in Seattle election campaigns during their time on the Commission.
