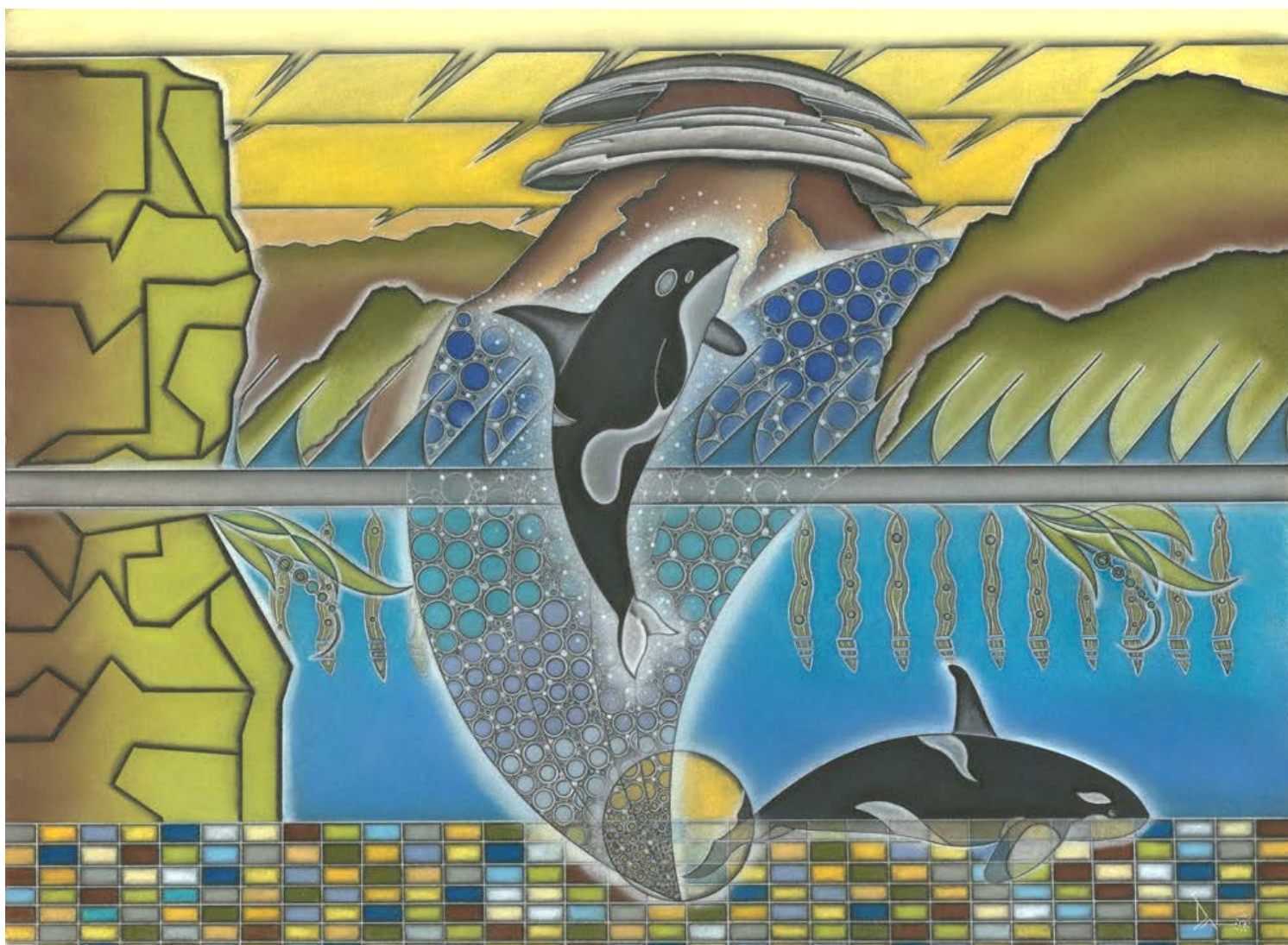


Ethnic Heritage Art Gallery Presents

Jarrood Da has worked as a visual artist for all his adult life. He is Tewa from San Ildefonso Pueblo in northern New Mexico. He grew up living in the four corners of the southwest where much of his time was spent traveling up and down the Continental Divide of southwestern Colorado to San Ildefonso Pueblo and Santa Fe. Staying close to his native roots, he learned to live his life by merging the two worlds of a contemporary lifestyle with the native way of life. Indigenous iconography and world view shape his artistic passions. His work has been widely collected and honored and is included in permanent collections across the nation. Through his artwork, he contemplates the constant struggle between the ever- expanding modern world and the natural world. He sees art as a link between past and present. Through the process of creation, he is joining his ancestors and honoring his culture, and he is also attempting to send a message of optimism to those generations yet to come.
