Eligibility	Due to the increased essential worker payments and increase in unemployed clients, many of our clients are no longer low-income per the HUD definition, but are struggling due to high Seattle rental rates. Moreover, not all of our clients will meet HUD's low income definition once the pandemic is over and they are able to go back to work, yet others will be low income due to the \$4 increase in pay ending. How is the RFP going to handle these changing income realities and are we still eligible to apply?	For this RFP, HSD will continue to use <u>HUD income guidelines</u> (80% AMI or lower) for client eligibility. Recent HSD partnerships with the community still reflect a huge need and demand in low income populations needing services and support.

As an example, at an HSD community engagement event, young people revealed interest in entrepreneurship, so for pre-employment support, it may look like skills development to become an entrepreneur. Other typical supports could be resume writing and interview skills. These are only examples. We encourage learning from young people and front-line staff on what would be most useful.
