If OLS investigates claims of an employer's alleged noncompliance under multiple ordinances, OLS reports those investigations and claims as a single case. Thus, each case may involve multiple, concurrent investigations of a single employer.

¹ Closures do not include matters addressed via Advisory Letter in initial enforcement of PSST and FCE (200 under PSST and 13 under FCE) These Letters resulted in numerous policy changes and monetary resolution of \$645.96; this amount is reflected in Section G, Monetary Remedies.

G. Monetary Remedies

Collections of unpaid final orders totaling \$247,211.65 have been referred to the City Legal Department for enforcement/recovery of amount due. Many employers subject to unpaid final orders are no longer in business. OLS recovered \$78,477.32 of \$140,947.28 due from one employer through a bankruptcy proceeding. Note that OLS reports monetary remedies each month, but the remedy is often not due the same month and may include cases on appeal. Thus, our reporting deflates the percentage of amount due collected.
