

No typical price range for residential improvements - shacks to modern dwellings in this area. There is a mixture of old and new houses in this area. There is generally an excessive annual assessment burdern in this area. Also has a transportation problem."

B15: "This locality is on the top of Beacon Hill and adjoins the Jefferson Golf Links. Property is occupied by people of moderate means. A few orientals live in this area but they are of the socially elite and professional type. The residences vary in age from 10 to 25 years old and are generally in good condition. Many new residences were built in this area prior to the depression."





Figure 71 • City of Seattle Redline map. "Prepared under the supervision of E. G. Wendland, H.O.L.C., Deputy State Appraiser, Seattle, WN., working in conjunction with M. R. Pattison, Chief Valuator, Fedral Housing Administration, Seattle Washington [...] January 10th, 1936." Overlaid on a 1935 Kroll Map.



OLD VAN ASSELT SCHOOL, 1909 CITY OF SEATTLE LANDMARK & 1950 ADDITION



- 3. An apartment building overlooking Kinnear Park, the Skyline House, 600 West Olympic Place, Seattle (1956)
- 4. Bothell Methodist Church, 18515 92nd Avenue NE, Bothell (1959)
- 5. Port of Seattle Shilshole Bay Marina Administration Building, Seattle (1961, demolished)
- 6. The Southwest Branch of Seattle Public Library, 9101 35th Avenue SW, West Seattle (1961, demolished) This building played an important role in the firm's business growth as it served as a stepping stone for the firm's later library work, such as the building at TESC and the Richland and Burien Public Libraries.
- 7. Fire Station No. 5, on Alaskan Way on Seattle's central waterfront (1964, City of Seattle Landmark). This concrete structure with a 60-foot tower received a Prestressed Concrete Institute design citation and a Seattle Times award.

- 9. Atmospheric Sciences Building on the University of Washington campus, Seattle (1970)
- 10. Horizon House Retirement Home, 900 University Place, on First Hill, Seattle (1971)
- 11. The Daniel J. Evans Library, The Evergreen State College (TESC), Olympia (1971)
