
Neighborhood map from Seattle City Clerk's Neighborhood Atlas


































PHYSICAL INTEGRITY























TIMELINE: Upper floor tenants

1915-31: Rex Sanitarium.











A RTISTIC and unique in design is the new residence planned for Mr. H. H. Dearborn, the well-known operator in tide lands and real estate, by Architect Henry Dozier. The house will be located on the southwest corner of Minor avenue and Seneca street, one of the most beautiful sites for a home in the city, Mr. Dearborn owns a double corner, for which he paid \$15,000. The cost of the residence, when completed, will be about \$20,000. The design combines the American and Japanese features of home architecture, with the graceful line effects of the latter and the commodious features of the former. It will be a model of modernity in fixtures and accommodations, and in appearance most pleasing to the eye.

The structure will be three stories in height, and there will be a basement running the length of the house, with something new and extraordinary on the roof, namely, a large observatory, suitable also for a den or retiring room. The roof will be tiled, and the material to be used in construction is brick veneer. Ample provision has been made for verandas and reception, music, retiring, dining and sewing rooms, and upper chambers. Large closets have been provided for each room, and the attic is arranged in such a manner that it may be utilized for baliroom purposes. The rooms on the first floor are arranged so that they can be thrown open, making one large room of the entire floor. Mr. Dearborn expects to let the contract for the work soon. Ills stables have already been constructed.



The building will be sixty feet in width and 120 feet in length, three stories in height and will cost approximately \$30,000. It will be fitted up with fifty tooms and wards. The exterior is to be entirely of pressed brick and stone. The builder thinks it will be ready for occupancy in




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
