

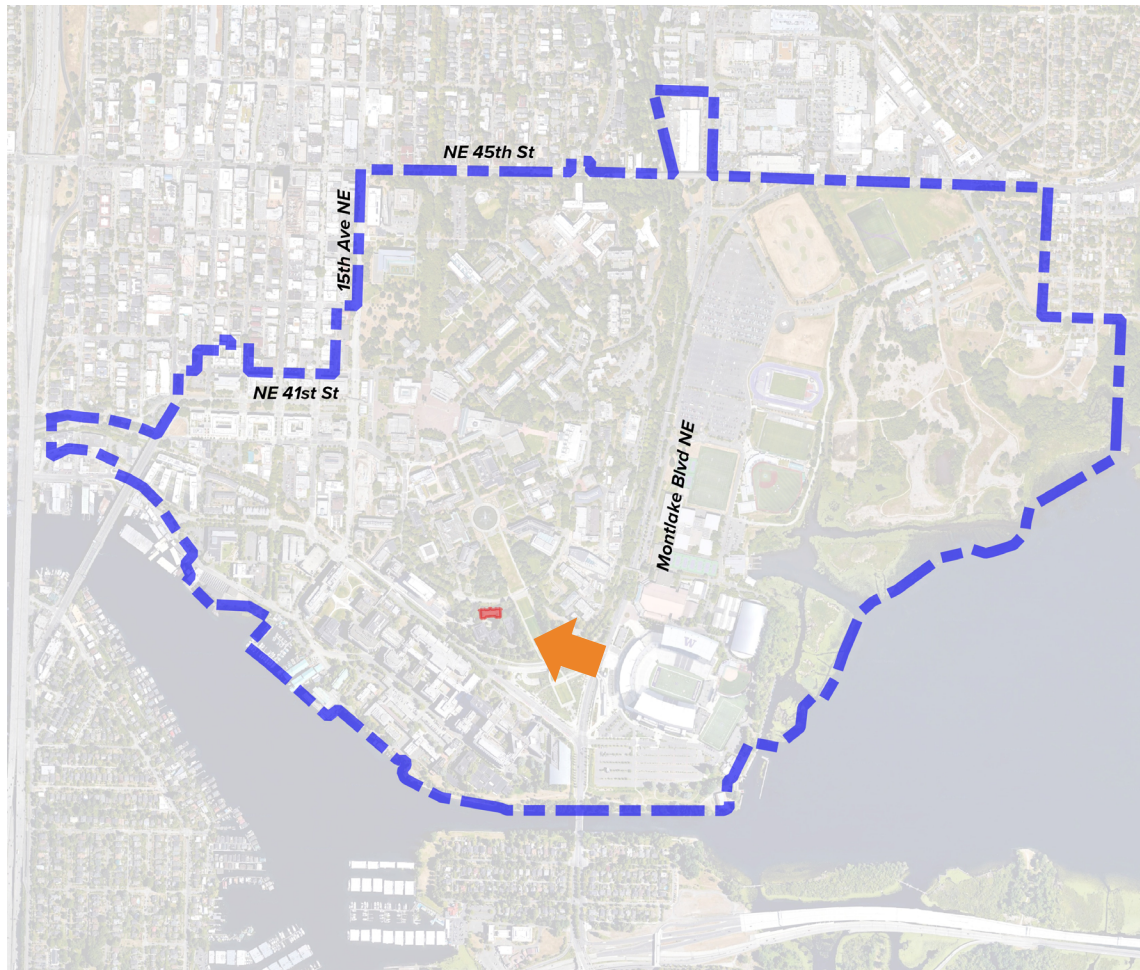

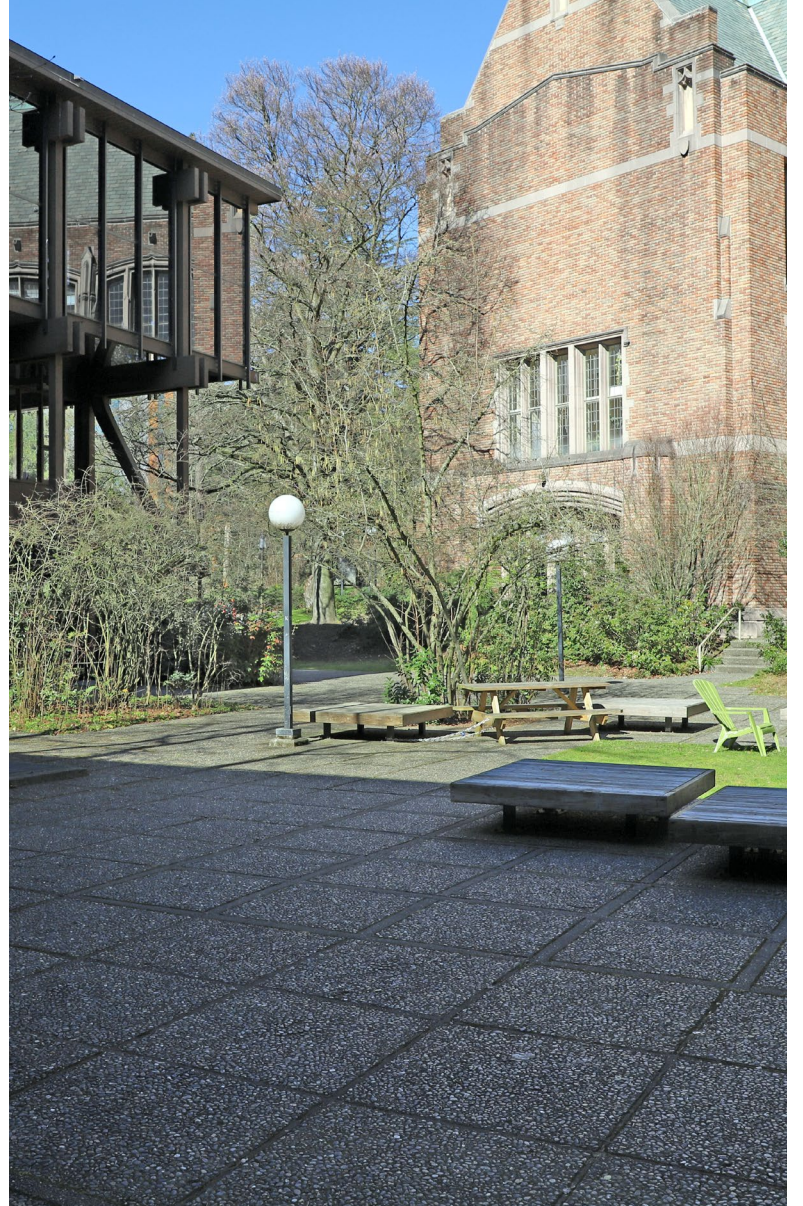


Campus Map



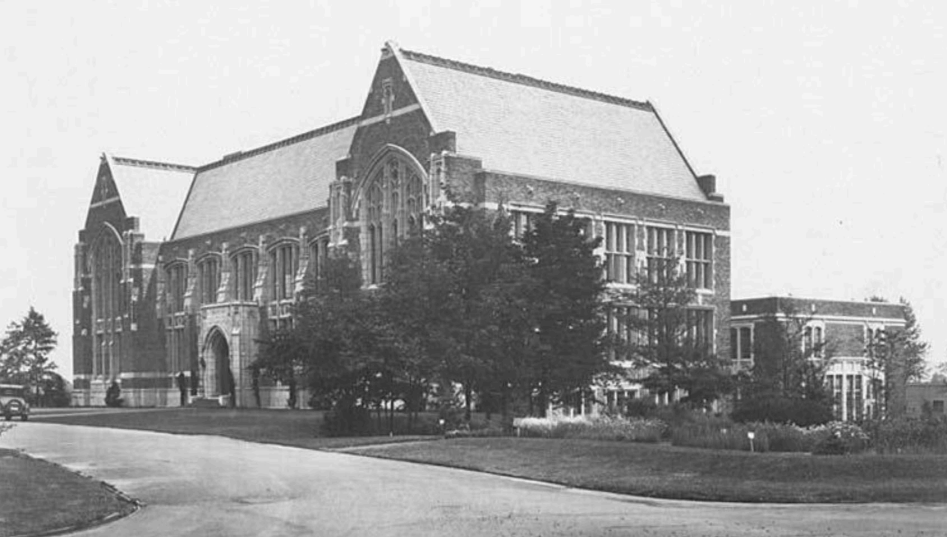
Nominated Property Map

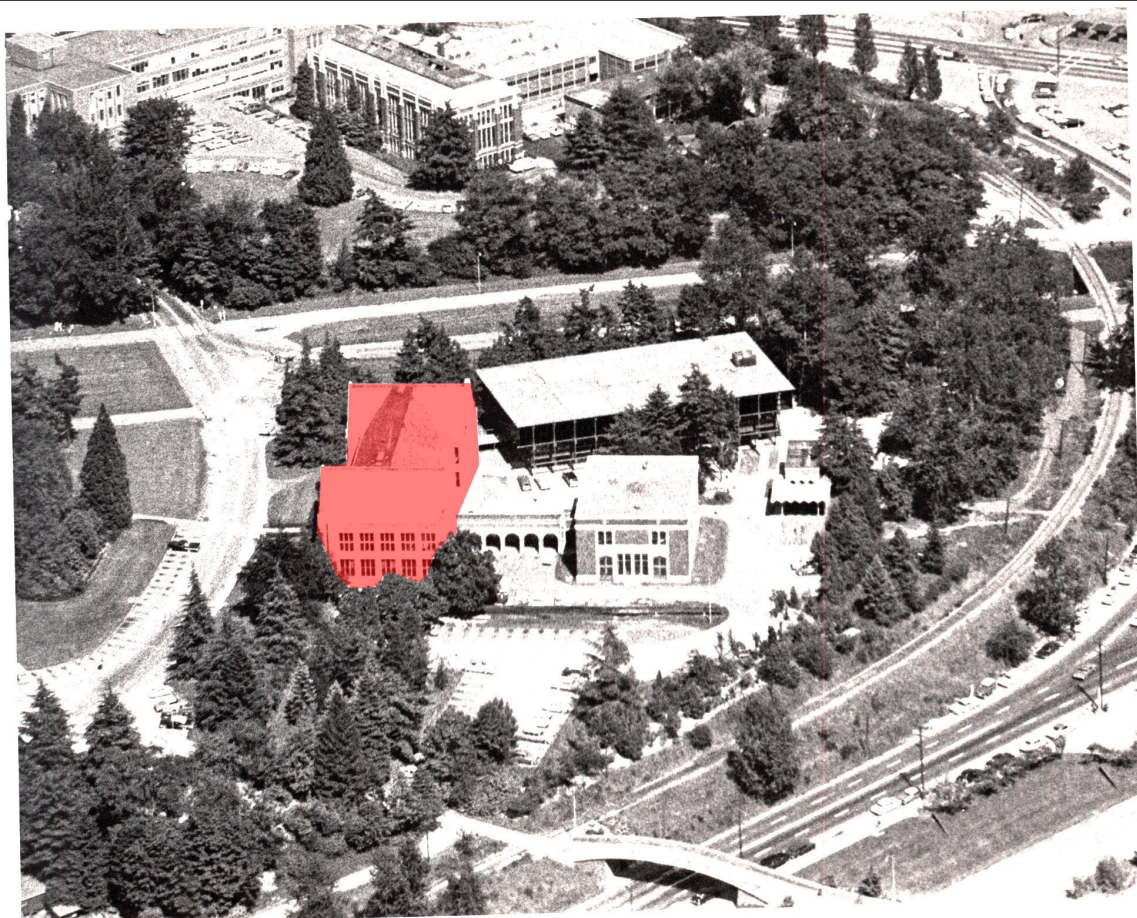




Ca. 1925-37 views shortly after construction showing lawn and small columnar conifers along building foundation.





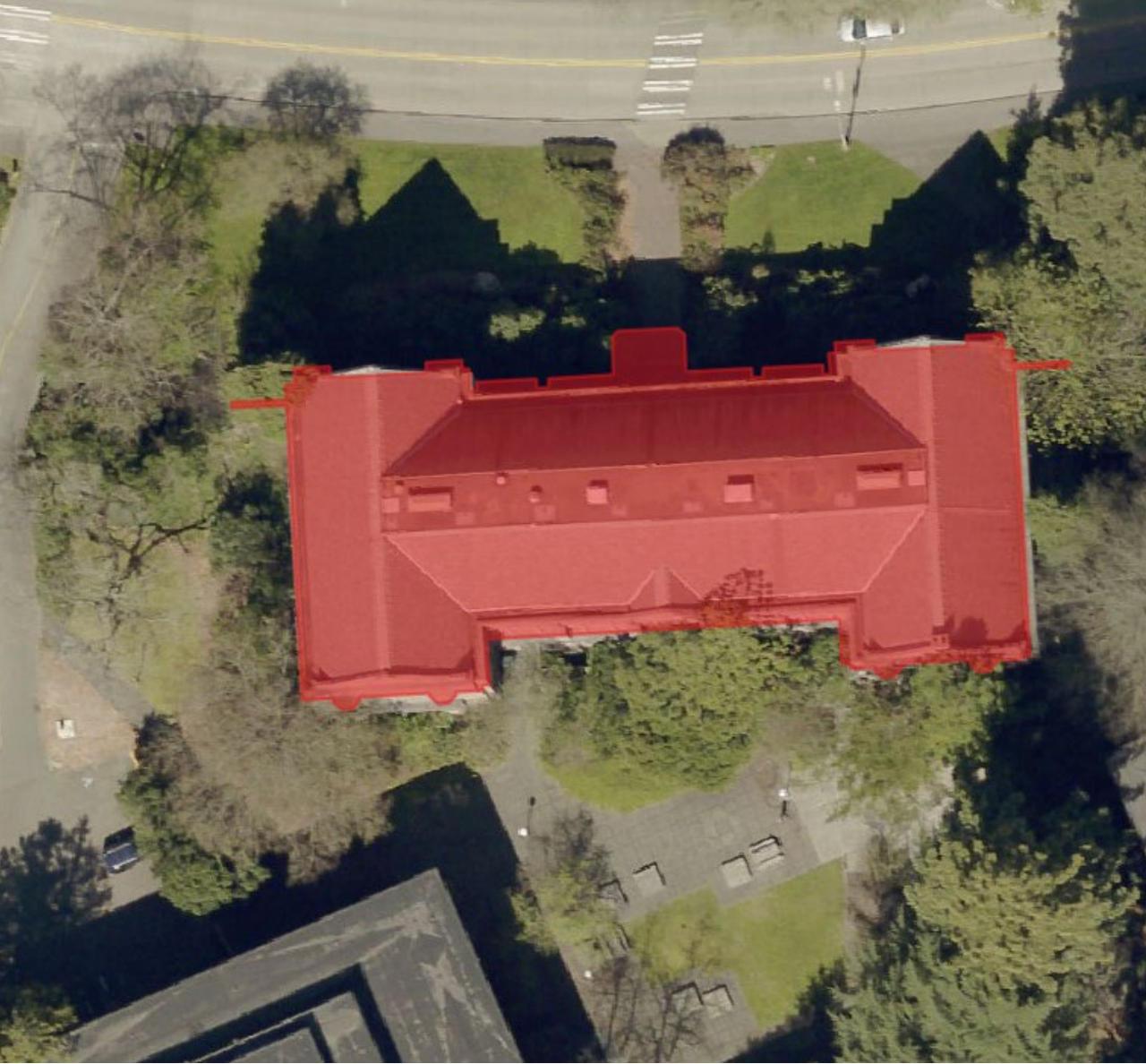


1965 photograph looking east showing Anderson Hall (red) immediately prior to construction of Bloedel Hall.

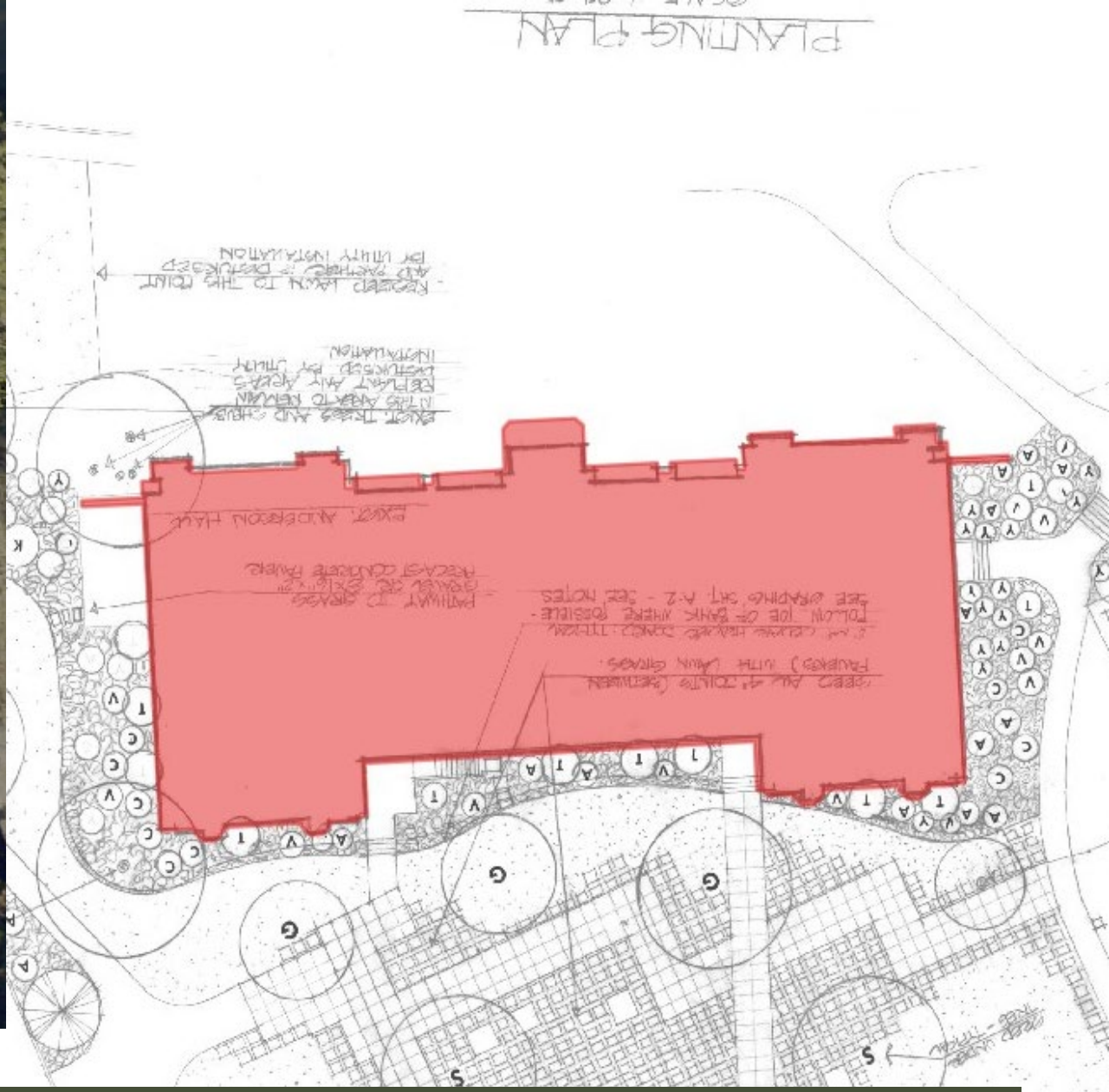


1973 photograph looking east from the southwest corner showing Anderson Hall (red) at left in relationship to the new Bloedel Hall courtyard.

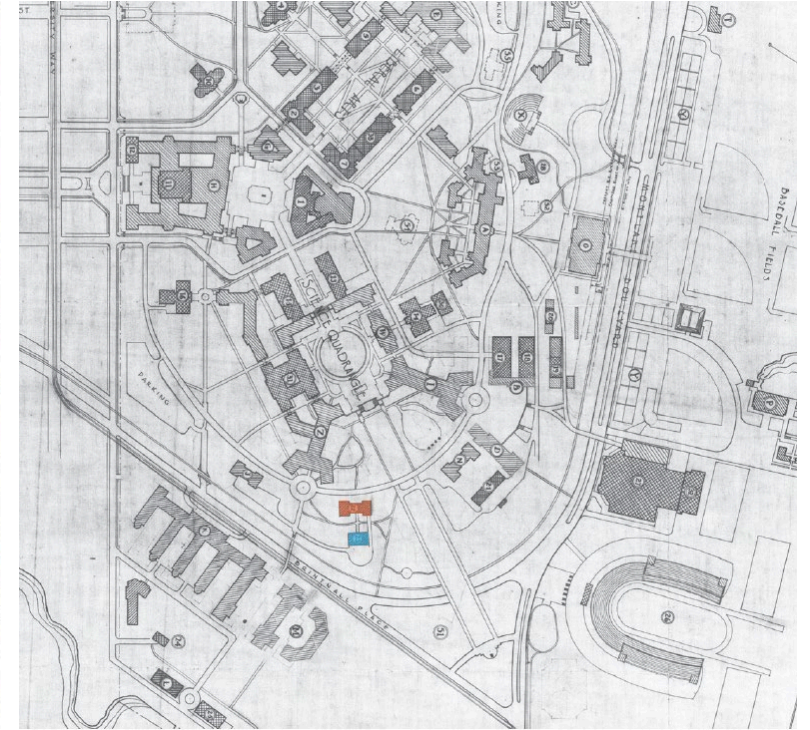

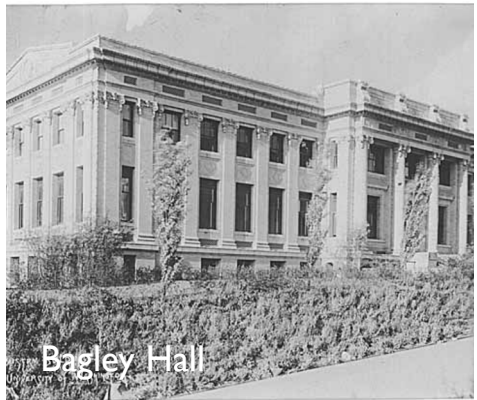

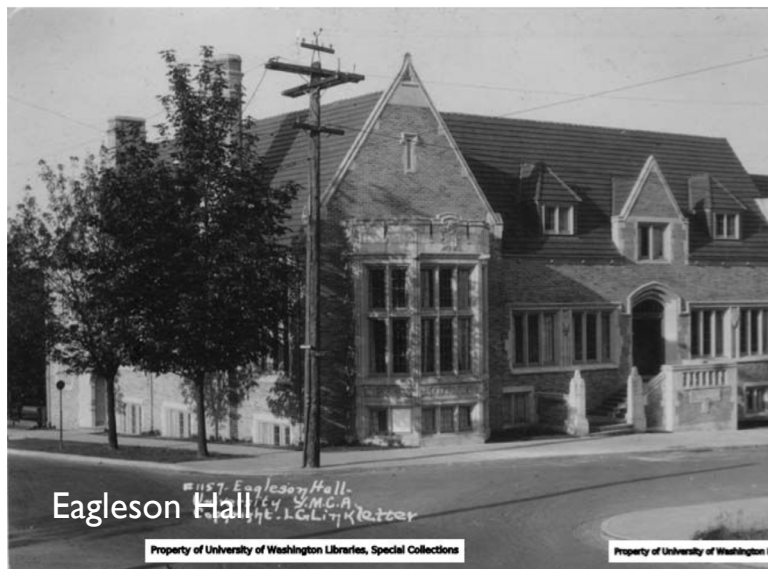
