DETECTIVE COOKIE'S CHESS PARK

For a decade, Detective Denise "Cookie" Bouldin has inspired Rainier Beach youth to avoid violence and become successful adults by developing critical thinking skills through the game of chess. Friends of Detective Cookie Chess Park is honoring this program with a park where the learning and fun can continue for Cookie's graduates and new players.

NMF GRANT: \$25,000 // COMMUNITY MATCH: \$12,556*

QUEEN ANNE'S PLAYSTREET

Queen Anne Greenways used their grant to create a play street next to the Queen Anne Farmer's Market. More than 400 people spent the day playing—riding trikes, bikes, and scooters, and getting to know each other.

55TH ANNIVERSARY OF MLK'S MARCH ON WASHINGTON COMMEMORATIVE CELEBRATION

Friends of MLK Civil Rights Memorial Park brought MLK Jr.'s "I have a Dream Speech" alive by commemorating its 55th anniversary in the historical community gathering space, Mount Zion Baptist Church. All were invited to share a meal, hear panel discussions and speeches, and draw connections between past and present civil rights issues.

NMF GRANT: \$5,000 // COMMUNITY MATCH: \$10,640

DNDA LET'S TALK RACE

The Delridge Neighborhood Development Association hosted a series of events that challenged institutional racism and fostered a culture of belonging and respect. They did this by connecting community organizations and individuals in the Delridge community and beyond through film, dialogue, storytelling and restorative justice.

NMF GRANT: \$51,213 // COMMUNITY MATCH: \$36,787
