

Best Day Ever Request for Proposals (RFP)

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Best Day Ever is a one-day, community-powered experience that celebrates the vibrancy, culture, and pride of Seattle's neighborhoods. A thriving neighborhood is one where residents feel connected, represented, and proud of where they live — and Best Day Ever is designed to bring that feeling to life. Each activation builds belonging through service, storytelling, movement, shared meals, joyful connection, and economic visibility for local small businesses.

Co-created by the Department of Neighborhoods (DON) and the Seattle Chamber of Connection (SCoC), Best Day Ever strengthens civic belonging by bringing people, place, and purpose together. Guided by DON's Community Engagement Framework and the Chamber's Six Points of Connection, this initiative uplifts community leadership and honors the histories, creativity, and cultural assets that make each neighborhood unique. The 2026 program will include seven activations — one in each of Seattle's seven districts. The inaugural event will take place in **March 2026 in South Park**, in partnership with Cultivate South Park.

Each activation includes five core components:

1. **Service** – Volunteerism and community-led projects
2. **Movement** – Neighborhood walks, dance, or fitness experiences
3. **Learning** – Storytelling, heritage sharing, and cultural education
4. **Gathering** – Shared meals hosted by local small businesses
5. **Connection** – Facilitated reflection and relationship-building

What We Are Looking for in Applicants We invite community-based organizations (CBOs), neighborhood groups, and cultural partners to apply to host a Best Day Ever activation in their district. Strong applicants will:

- **Demonstrate deep relationships** in their neighborhood — especially with residents, small businesses, and cultural communities.
- **Showcase the unique identity** of their district: its history, creativity, and the people who make it special.
- **Collaborate with multiple partners** by forming a diverse Leadership Committee (7–10 members) to co-design and co-lead the event.
- **Uplift BIPOC communities and historically excluded voices**, ensuring cultural authenticity and representation.
- **Propose activities rooted in local assets**, existing traditions, and neighborhood pride.
- **Create meaningful volunteer opportunities**, inviting both longtime residents and newcomers into shared purpose.
- **Demonstrate readiness** — clear planning steps, partner commitments, budget clarity, and site permissions.

Organizations may optionally apply for the **Small Sparks Fund** to support project costs. The Best Day Ever RFP launches **December 19, 2025**, aligning with the reopening of Small Sparks in **January 2026** (TBD).

Best Day Ever is a celebration of community — and we’re excited to partner with organizations ready to uplift the beauty, resilience, and creativity of their neighborhood.
