We're inviting young artists to showcase their creativity and talent by expressing what "meaningful police oversight" looks like. Youth may paint, draw, illustrate, or use mixed media. Submissions must be scanned and emailed or mailed to OPA by March 17, 2024. The first-place winner will receive a Samsung Galaxy Tab S6 Lite with S Pen and have their art featured in OPA's 2023 annual report and monthly newsletter. Runners-up will also be featured in OPA's annual report and newsletter.

Details

- First-prize winner receives:

 - And will be featured in OPA's 2023 annual report and monthly newsletter!
- Runners-up will be showcased in OPA's 2023 annual report and monthly newsletter.
- The contest is open to elementary, middle, and high school students living or attending school in Seattle under 18 years old.
- Artwork must be original.
- Submissions must be larger than 5x7 in. and no larger than 8.5x11 in. and scanned as hi-resolution JPEG, PNG, or PDF files.
- Submitting art grants OPA permission to use it in its 2023 annual report, monthly newsletter, and social media.
- Artwork will be unaltered and attributed to the artist, including their age and grade level.
