# NOTICE OF PROPOSED REZONE, LAND USE CODE AMENDMENTS AND ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

Pursuant to SMC 25.05.340 and WAC 197-11-340

The Department of Planning and Development (DPD) is proposing to amend the Official Land Use Map and Land Use Code (Title 23) to create a walkable, neighborhood-oriented town center along Linden Avenue N. The proposal also rezones parcels on Aurora Avenue N. to allow a wider range of uses. The proposals are based on the Broadview – Bitter Lake – Haller Lake Neighborhood Plan Update (2012). The proposal includes changes to zoning designations to add Pedestrian designations along Linden Avenue N., encourage mixed-use development, and increase height limits,. Code amendments include new standards for development on large lots.

The proposed rezones are within the Bitter Lake Hub Urban Village and are within areas designated Commercial/Mixed Use on the Comprehensive Plan's Future Land Use Map.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION**

DPD has determined that the amendment described above will not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and has issued a Determination of Non-Significance (no Environmental Impact Statement required).
