- 2. If you prefer to respond to the following questions in another format than this PDF, limit narrative responses to questions 1-5 to a total of 6 pages. Organizations who received EDI grants in funding rounds *prior to 2020* also need to complete questions 6-10 and limit narrative responses to all questions to a total of 10 pages.
- 3. Applicants may submit budgets and schedules in the format you prefer; the forms in **Attachment B** are provided as optional templates. These documents do NOT count toward the page limits noted in #2 above.

Narrative Questions for ALL Applicants (1-5)

1. Briefly describe your organization and your proposed EDI Project or anti-displacement strategy, including the project geographic site, who will lead the work, partners that will be or may be involved, and the roles they will have in the project. Describes the demographics of the people you intend to serve and the driving displacement risk and/or identified opportunity gaps this community experiences. Please refer to the Scoring System #4 Displacement Risk and #5 Access to Opportunity for guidance on answering this question.

2. How does your project vision align with EDI goals? How does your proposed project address the six equity drivers? Describe how your project advances three of the Equity Drivers and identify outcomes that the project will influence. Explicitly identify the outcomes that are most relevant for their community and what the benefits of the project will be to the community. *Please refer to the Scoring System #1 Equity Drivers for guidance on answering this question.*

3. Describe who this project will serve and how impacted members of your community have been involved in design and development of the project to date. What community/neighborhood engagement has been conducted to identify and prioritize this project? How has this project been identified as a priority? Who has been involved? If additional community engagement is needed, please describe the plan for outreach. Include a description of your organization's governance structure and how the staff and leadership reflect the community being served by the project. Please refer to the Scoring System #3 Depth of Relationship for guidance on answering this question.

4. There are two categories of EDI Eligible Uses: Capacity Building (provide narrative response for question 4a) and Capital Project Development (provide narrative response for question4b). Applicants may apply for funds from one or both categories.

6. Detail how you have maintained accountability with your community. Identify any areas where governance structures and/or performance diverged from what was proposed in the initial application and provide an explanation of any discrepancies.

7. The EDI fund's ongoing support is intended to provide stability while an organization identifies more diverse funding sources. Please identify your sustainability strategy, starting with 2020 activities, to expand the sources of operations support beyond EDI capacity-building grants.

8. Identify ways in which you have uplifted or partnered with other organizations operating in your community who have not received EDI capacity-building support. Examples could include: providing financial support to partner orgs, providing information and technical support, using administrative capacity as a backbone for shared community projects.
