One Seattle Executive Order to Advance Climate Resilience and Reduce Transportation Emissions

Seattle is facing a climate emergency. Extreme heat and wildfire smoke, sea level rise and flooding, and longterm declines in snowpack that feeds our watershed and impacts our City-led electric utility are the new normal, hitting our communities of color first and worst.



The most recent Greenhouse Gas Inventory showed that while Seattle has reduced emissions by 12% since 2008, **we need to move faster to reach our goal** of net zero emissions by 2050.

On Earth Day 2025, Mayor Harrell issued an Executive Order (EO) for Seattle to develop a modernized Climate Action Plan focused on climate resilience and adaptation, building a green economy, and protecting public health, as well as near-term actions to reduce transportation emissions.

One Seattle Earth Day Executive Order Details



Directing City departments to develop new Climate Action Plan to meet the scale of the climate crisis. Actions include:

- Deliver a **progress report** on the 2013 Climate Action Plan in 2025.
- **Inclusive engagement** with most impacted communities, develop an advisory panel, and collaborate with Tribal governments.
- Add **new focus** on climate resilience and adaptation, building a green economy, and protecting public health.
- Release a final Climate Action Plan by Q3 2026.
- Evaluate and recommend **revenue-generating policies**, investment strategies, and projects by Q4 2026 to support the CAP.
- Develop framework to monitor, evaluate, and report on progress.

Directing City departments to implement high-impact actions to reduce transportation emissions, including:

- Encourage 80% of attendees to use non-personal vehicles during the 2026 **FIFA World Cup.**
- Continue to develop three **Low Pollution Neighborhoods** by 2028 and generate an implementation and funding plan.
- Accelerate **transportation electrification** and explore more public charging options.
- Implement transportation demand management strategies aligned with the Revive I-5 project.
- Pursue renewal of the **Seattle Transit Measure** to ensure sustainable transportation options beyond 2027.
