APPROVE MEETING MINUTES

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE UPDATES & ANNOUNCEMENTS

- Letter of Support for Seattle City Light federal funding application. There is not enough time to get a letter of support to City Light for their application. There has also been some concern about the benefits of supporting the efforts. Regardless of the letter of support, City Light has expressed an interest in continuing to build a relationship with the Oversight Board.
- Recommendation/Comment Letter to Comprehensive Plan and Transportation Levy Proposal.
 The Board's comment letter was submitted to the appropriate channels and Elise has let programmatic staff and Department directors know that the Board is following both efforts closely.
- **2021 Seattle Energy Code (SEC) Update.** The Board is closely tracking the proposed 2021 Energy Code Updates. It is important for the Energy code to promote better energy efficiency initiatives.

 - CCAB meeting 6/6 Discussion on the amendments. Open to the public and taking public comment.

- As early as September 30th: 2021 SEC goes into effect.
- 2021 SEC Update Discussion:
 - **Steve Gelb** said it would be good to push for the code and is willing to support on drafting letter.
 - Nina Olivier will draft a letter.

POLICIES, PROJECTS, PROGRAMS COMMITTEE UPDATE

- Revolving Loan to Leverage IRA Direct Pay Tax Credits for Energy for Affordable Housing
