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Premier Golf a Troon Company 2023 Annual Report

Executive Summary

2023 continued the upward trend of growth in golf across the country with the National Golf Association reporting a 4.2% average increase across the country and the growth at public courses up 4.5%. Golf saw record revenue exceeding the records set in 2021. The expectation continued to be that new golfers would go back to their former lives leaving golf behind. It was a pleasant surprise that the momentum of golf continued through 2023 with participation surpassing the record rounds numbers of 2021 and Revenue again reaching Record levels surpassing records established in 2021. Offering a healthy and safe environment allowing people to go outside, get some fresh air, and have fun, continued to keep golf a go to activity in 2023.

Seattle Golf Courses

Revenue topped off the year at \$18,789,319, which was \$1,880,172 (11%) more than the record revenue from 2021 and 12% more than 2022. Rounds at the golf courses remained strong throughout the year finishing 2023 at 274,157 up 1% over the record set in 2021 and 8% up over 2022.

After the golf course survived record weather extremes in 2022, with average temperatures and rainfall below average, 2023 turned out to be a great year to enjoy the hospitality of our facilities and a round of golf out on the courses, leading to another Record Revenue year for golf at the Seattle Golf Courses.

Operating Expenses came in higher than prior year, and higher than budget, and Payroll came in higher than prior year and higher than budget. Operating expenses saw an increase largely due to supply chain issues leading to higher costs associated with higher demand. Payroll was up 15% over prior year, but up only 10% over budget with minimum wage increases and in a tight labor market as everyone struggled to retain good talent.

Revenue at the Seattle Golf Courses not only exceeded expectations for the year but set new Records across nearly all departments. Golf remained strong in Seattle and the course was not only able to retain the golfers, but they were also able to add growth to those numbers in 2023. Kudos to the team for a successful year.

Cost of Goods Sold (COGS) was on track with sales for the year. Operating expenses came in over budget and prior year in large part due to Payroll expenses as the course worked to retain top talent in a struggling labor market leading to a labor increase of over \$500,000. Maintenance and Security were both up nearly \$50,000 for the year while the 2022 technology transition led to an overage of \$70,000 due to the payment for the transition did not happen until 2023,

The Premier Golf Loyalty Program was rebranded to the Premier Frequent Players Program and continues to be the largest golf affinity reward program in the Pacific Northwest. In 2022, 48,062 unique golfers spent \$19,414,914 at Premier managed courses. A couple of changes were made to the points levels to reward the most frequent players and removed range balls as a discount item. Members still earn points on every dollar spent and the Frequent Player Program still emphasizes smaller discounts during in-season golf and earn larger discounts in the off-season, encouraging play in the wetter, winter months.



The Premier's Frequent Players Program continues to help retain customers by rewarding their loyalty, providing strong incentives to come back again and again rather than choosing to play at another course in the area that is offering one-off discounts to attract customers. It attracts Premier Frequent Players from other Premier Managed courses to the Seattle courses.

The program resets points levels on May 1st each year allowing frequent golfers to earn discounts at progressively increasing levels:

Public Benefits

The benefits that a golf course offers the community have a variety of faces. There are benefits to the biodiversity and ecology of the surrounding areas, benefits to the local flora and fauna, as well as improving mental health, reducing stress, and creating a sense of community. This has never been more evident as we experience the rapidly expanding urban development around us. The preservation of greenery supports sustainable practices, and no place offers more outdoor space than parks, trails, and yes - golf courses.

A Superintendent's Note

Golf courses aren't just for people that play golf. They're an ecosystem unto themselves, diverse in micro- and macro-organisms up and down the food chain. These diverse green spaces of mowed turf, trees, and natural/unmaintained areas bestow a variety of benefits to the surrounding community and wildlife, and one does not even need to play the game to reap the rewards! Let's examine some of the key perks these properties bring to the table, especially in an urbanized setting.



Green spaces throughout our cities serve not only as an aesthetic enhancement, but as a lifeline in an increasingly concrete world. Golf courses supply wildlife habitat. Here in the Puget Northwest region, it's normal to see birds of prey thrive (Eagle, hawk, owl, falcon), and land animals like raccoon families, possum, coyote, and deer call the nooks and crannies home. Beautiful migratory birds (duck, geese, etc.) come from great distances to these properties to overwinter. Mallard ducks breed multiple clutches during the spring and raise their chicks in the pond ecosystems. It's nearing my favorite time of year, spring, and I know it truly arrives when the red-winged black bird sings that unmistakable song while hidden in the cattail. Truly, it's a beautiful orchestration of nature using the space allotted amongst the adjacent concrete human beings call "development."





Green spaces improve the quality of the air we breathe, enhance the biodiversity around us, and offer vital spaces for socialization and recreation. As we face the challenge of balancing the need for development with the preservation of these urban oases; parks, trails, and golf courses become that sustainable resource that is essential to our future.

Soil is a non-renewable resource. Topsoil layers can take generations to form so protecting this asset from erosion due to water and wind is valuable. Turfgrass does just that. The dense system of roots and shoots mitigate surface water run-off. In fact, agricultural extension agents recommend grass buffer strips around cropland and feedlots to reduce runoff which helps keep soil and nutrients from entering waterways. Airports and roadways use turf to prevent damage from dust. It's one of the more inexpensive, durable ground covers.

Rain is an important source of clean groundwater. During severe storms, water may run into streams and lakes, where it can't move through the soil to reach the groundwater. Turf absorbs and filters runoff water during and after storms due to its growth habit and ecosystem which creates tiny spaces that trap and hold moisture. As water soaks into the grass and soil below, it is filtered and cleansed as groundwater is recharged.

How about community aesthetic enhancements? Green is good, yes? Most people would probably agree that looking out over a green landscape gives a sense of general pleasure and well-being. Studies dating back to the 1970's show that greenery from grass and trees help satisfy this need, and health benefits, mental and physical, derived from these green-scapes contribute to social harmony, stability, and work productivity due to a more positive attitude. Turf also reduces noise levels by as much as 30 percent and cuts glare along hardscapes. How we use vegetation in urban areas is crucial to how we feel about our surroundings. This aesthetic is important to the human spirit, just ask any good city planner!



Turf moderates the climate. It cools city streets and reduces energy costs of cooling homes and businesses. Concrete and other hard building materials often cause urban areas to be ten degrees warmer than nearby rural areas. Turf also improves the air we breathe, a landscape of turf, trees, and shrubs about 2,000 square feet in size can generate enough oxygen for one person for a full year. Turfgrass also absorbs smog-produced ozone and sulfur dioxide.





Opportunities for recreation are significantly increased when turfgrass is involved. It is the main playing surface for most outdoor sports and provides solid footing and cushion for patrons and thus is an important safety factor. Simply put, it supplies the opportunity to exercise outdoors. Golf strongly, appeals to an ageing demographic due to its ease of participation as a conduit for outdoor exercise. In research studies, participants of golf lowered their cholesterol levels by walking the course when they played, an average nine-hole course covers about two miles. Many communities have found that a golf course is an excellent way to restore damaged and unmaintained areas. Beautiful golf courses exist today where abandoned quarries, strip mines, and landfills once stood, thus combining the benefits of turf with the beauty of landscaping.

Golf has grown in popularity and now appeals to a broader range of people than ever before. The National Golf Foundation estimates rounds played in 2023 exceeded 26.5 million. That's over a hundred million hours spent outside playing one of 15,000 golf courses in this country. And by the way, more than 78 percent of the rounds played are on public golf courses. Overall rounds saw an increase of 4.2% over 2022, while public access courses were up 4.5% during the same period. With these concepts in mind, it's not difficult to recognize the value golf courses bring to our communities.

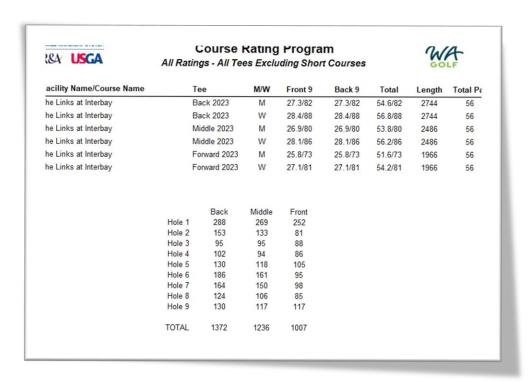

- We were forced to order \$2,113.22 worth of replacement parts, bringing our total expenses to keep the range running to around \$5,000 so far this year.
- o The driving range was sliced, fertilized, and top-dressed with organics.



March

- \$15,000 was spent on new range mats for the driving range. Our last range mat purchase was in 2021.
- o 800lbs of grass seed applied to the fairways along with several tons of sand.
- Shoreline School District began their high school golf season.
- o Food and Beverage revenue was up 44% MTD 2022 and up 26% MTD 2021.
- One of our primary mowers lost a wheel and was out of commission for a few days.



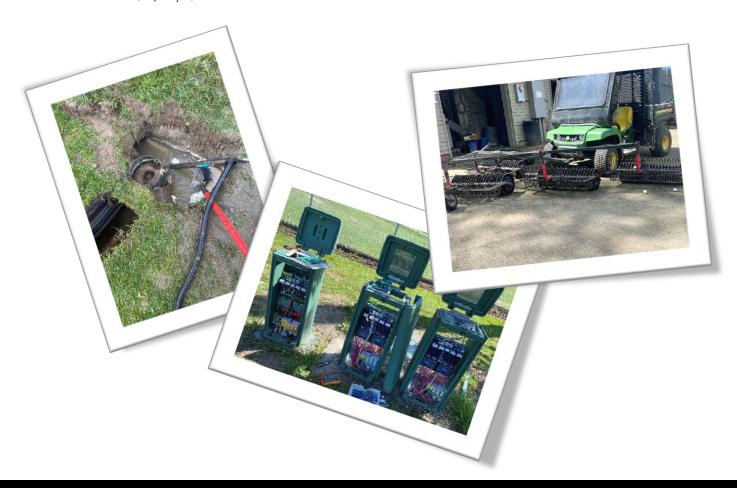
April

- For the month of April Jackson Park total revenue was up 11% MTD 2022, finishing at \$334.024.
- Another motor blew on the ball elevator in the washroom and a replacement was purchased for \$1,500.
- o Aerification was completed on the greens, tees, collars, and approaches.
- o Our new USGA course rating was put in effect along with revamp scorecards.
- o Driving range revenue was up 30% MTD April 2022, with total revenue of \$76,108.
- o Range condition improved mid-way through the month.
- o Pro Shop was reset with the arrival of 2023 merchandise.



May

- The Jackson Jill's held their monthly shotgun event on the morning of the 4th followed by their monthly club meeting and turnout was exceptional.
- The irrigation main line ruptured on hole 12 fairway.
- Updated irrigation control systems were installed.
- Driving range revenue was up 16% MTD May 2022, with total revenue of \$82,890.
- New wheels and baskets were purchased and installed for the picker.
- Lesson revenue was up 19% MTD 2022 and up 59% MTD 2021, with total revenue of \$17,267.



June

- Our sound system on the range was updated by Jade electronic for ~\$9,000. This
 included new speakers, a high-powered amplifier, extended Bluetooth antenna and
 labor.
- With the help of The First Tee and Amazon we were able to re-sod the fourth green on the short nine.
- With the help of Kemp West, the turf team were able to partially restore hole #14 to its original design. Over the years invasive species were left unchecked around the pond and the excess shade was having a negative impact on water quality as well as blocking sightlines to the green from the right side of the fairway.

 For the month of June Jackson Park total revenue was up 13% MTD 2022, finishing at \$532,332.



July

- The beginning of July got off to a rough start with a tree falling, taking out our power and internet early in the morning on July 4th. Power wasn't restored until 4:00PM that day and our internet connection wasn't restored until the evening of the 7th.
- Northwest Harvest and the men's club also held their annual Harvest Against Hunger charity tournament on the 25th. Highlight of the event was a putt worth \$10,000, half going to the winner and half going to the charity.
- Four Cayote pups moved into the golf course, and they are roaming around their new home mostly in the early mornings.
- o Driving range revenue was up 6% MTD July 2022, with total revenue of \$89,404.



August

- For the month of August Jackson Park total revenue was up 5% MTD 2022, finishing at \$529,087.
- Jackson Jills finished up their three round Club Championship on August 17th with Deb Schooling taking first place first flight and Rebecca Early taking first place second flight.
- New equipment for the ball washroom and an all-new vacuum tube system was installed in early August totaling just over \$39,000.
- The Jackson Park Men's Golf Club participated in the annual Seattle Cup competition that was held over the last two weekends of the month and came up two points short of the title.
- A new sliding gate was installed by All City Fence with a laser sensor on the outbound side.
- o A packed junior camp season came to an end.



September

- For the month of September Jackson Park total revenue was up 1% MTD 2022, finishing at \$382,699.
- Greens, Tees, Collars and Approaches where all punched and sanded early in the month.
- The resident cayote pups were up to no good and caused notable damage around the course, but they do seem to be thriving.
- TopTracer revenue totaled \$5,701 for the month and was up 69% from 2022.
- On September 23rd our men's club held their annual Fall Field Day in celebration of Dan Puetz Sr. Dan is a lifetime member, past president, and treasurer for the Men's Club Board, and has captained the Seattle Cup.



October

- Significant growth in Pro Shop, F&B and Range revenue helped us stay in the black for the month and set several revenue records along the way.
- Jackson Park total revenue was up 7% MTD 2022, finishing at \$287,468.
- Our annual Premier Cup was held over the same weekend in beautiful Ocean Shores, WA. Jackson Park sent two teams to the competition, led by General Manager Tony Wilkins and Assistant Professional Ben Simpson.
- Jon and his team sliced and top-dressed about 30 yards of sand over the driving range infield in preparation for inclement weather.
- The turf team added new flagsticks with rangefinder prisms to the regulation course and a pink flag was flown on the 18th green for the month in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness.
- New tee markers were placed, and broken tee receptacles were replaced on all tee boxes.



November

- For the month of November Jackson Park total revenue was up 21% MTD 2022, finishing at \$157,287.
- The Jackson Jill's finished out the 2023 season in November. Special thanks go out to Jan Williams and Corinne Tokerud for the fantastic work they did all season managing the weekly competition.
- The turf crew began upgrading our central irrigation system, moving from a Toro Site Pro to Toro Lynx. The system was over 20 years old and in desperate need of an upgrade.
- Food and Beverage revenue was up 30% MTD 2022 and up 77% MTD 2021 totaling \$23,972. Food sales were up 37% MTD, Beer & Wine sales were up 31% and liquor sales were up 13%.
- o New wiring and light fixture were installed in the pro shop and the restaurant.
- Lesson revenue was up 40% MTD 2022 and up 94% MTD 2021, with total revenue of \$6,303.
- Instruction staff is kept busy planning programs for next season and working on our putter studio buildout behind the range office.



December

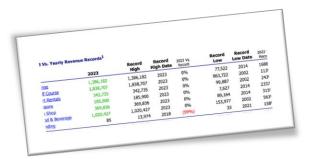
- We received and accepted an adjusted bid from VECA to install TopTracer bays on the second set of stalls on our lower range. Work began in late December and should be complete by the end of January.
- The Jackson Jill's held their annual end of the year holiday party in mid-December and a special thank you goes out to Jan Williams and the rest of the Jills' board for their exceptional leadership all season.
- Late in 2023 we began field testing a new automated pushcart rental service called Caddified.
- We took delivery and installed a new bed knife grinder in the mechanic's shop which should help fairway mowing next season.
- Driving range revenue was up 166% MTD December 2022, with total revenue of \$45,29.

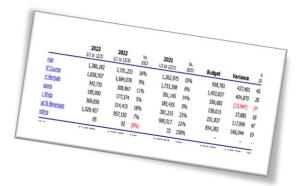


Jefferson Park Golf Course

Facility Highlights

2023 was a record setting year for all departments. We finished with \$5,143,870 in total revenue. This is the first time Jefferson Park has crossed the 5-million-dollar mark. We had an 11% increase in revenue over last year.





Jefferson also continues to be a leader in promoting the Washington State Golf Associations Youth on Course program. The price of a round of golf shouldn't be a barrier for a young person who wants to play - that's where Youth on Course comes in. They provide 130,000+ members with access to play over 1,700 golf courses for \$5 or less, giving them opportunities to learn lessons that can be taught in a way only a golf course can. And beyond affordable golf, we provide opportunities for young people to get the support they need to succeed through career prep, leadership, and scholarship programs. Jefferson Park hosted over 1000 Youth-on-Course rounds in 2023 and remains a very popular program. This was a significant increase from 2022. This program was also utilized by the First Tee headquarters being located here at Jefferson Park. Jefferson Park remains closely involved with the First Tee of Greater Seattle Area. Numerous events, classes, coaching seminars were held at Jefferson Park throughout the year.



We had a few new pieces of equipment purchased or leased in 2023 including at new range picker assembly, Club Car tempo walk automated carts (lease), the installation of 25 TopTracer monitors in the remaining range stalls (lease), and the renovation and repair of our on-course bathrooms that was completed by a City Parks crew.



We ended up seeing a record number of rounds played at Jefferson in 2023. We had 74,914 rounds played this year. We also hosted multiple private events and community events throughout the year.

Course

- · Removal of some unsafe trees throughout the course
- Trimmed up all low hanging tree branches
- Tree removal on the back side of #1
- Addition of 2 greenside bunkers on #14 after losing a tree due to a storm



At the request of the Veteran Affairs hospital physical therapy department, we have borrowed an ADA compliant golf cart from American Lakes Golf Course in Tacoma for this spring season. This allows us to offer a service to the PT department and have their patients come onto the course and work on their swing. See photos of the first session.



Range

Our driving range saw a significant increase in revenue from 2022 to 2023. We ended up 16% over last year and 45% over budgeted revenue projections. This was in large part due to the installation of our TopTracer stalls. In May we outfitted the rest of our range with TopTracer technology. This technology allows user to create not only a fun social atmosphere but a great training and practice session as well. We are thrilled that out customers have seen such great success with this modern technology.

Another major focus this year was maintaining our commitment to great customer experience. We continued to prioritize range cleanliness and top of the line range equipment including heaters, range mats, and range balls, and range ball dispensers.



Food & Beverage

2023 was another record year for the f&b department. We cross the million-dollar mark for the first time in this department and hosted many non-golf related community events in our banquet room.

On February 28th Seattle Parks & Rec hosted an update in our banquet room to inform the local community and golfers where the back 9 netting project currently stands. Shannon Glass brought schematic renderings and provided a brief status update to a room of about 50 people. Afterwards she, Larry Glaser (Course Super), and Mike Fosnick (Premier Dir. Of Operations) responded to general questions and concerns from all sides. With regards to the netting installation most of the room was in full support of the install. We look forward to hearing more news on this project as we move into 2024.





Pro Shop

Another record setting department in 2023 was the pro shop merchandise. Year after year since the pandemic we are setting new highs in the pro shop. The combination of good product selections and a steady stream of new golfers looking for equipment has led to a steady increase each year. We ended up 18% over last year in pro shop revenue. We also added a few logoed merchandise options as people enjoy representing our brand and Beacon Hill community.





When it comes to community outreach, we continued to be home of the Hi-Tee Little League golf program. Their mission statement is,

"Our goal is to take guns out of the hands of the youth and replace them with golf clubs. Teach them to take a shot with a 9-iron golf club and not a 9mm gun. We look to give the youth the opportunity to learn life skills through the game of golf. We will encourage and empower youth through fun and challenging experiences by supplying a platform based on Education, Integrity and Leadership skills. The program will help youth grow on and off the golf course."

Hi-Tee had numerous events at Jefferson Park throughout the year providing a great learning experience for many local youths.



Jefferson Park - By the Month

January:

The new year started with a bang at Jefferson Park setting any records in January of 2023 in Driving Range, Cart Rentals, Pro Shop, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! January finished 17% ahead of 2022 and 13% ahead of the 2021, the previous record holder. Cooperative weather has continued into February giving us a strong start to the year, often overtaken by cold wet weather.

February:

Early 2023 continues to shine - so to speak - at Jefferson Park setting any records in February of 2023 in Driving Range and lesson sales! February finished just 3% shy of 2022 but 61% ahead of budget. Cold but mostly cooperative weather has continued into March giving us a strong start to the year, often overtaken by cold wet weather. Year-todate through February we are 6% up on 2022 and 63% ahead of budget.

March:

O Jefferson Park continues to set records in March of 2023 in Cart Rentals, Lessons, Pro Shop sales, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! March finished just 13% ahead of 2022 and 28% ahead of budget. Cold but mostly cooperative weather has continued into March giving us a strong start to the year, often overtaken by cold wet weather. Year-to-date through March we are 9% up on 2022 and 45% ahead of budget.

April:

April was a record setting month in 2023 in Lesson Sales! April finished 9% ahead of 2022 and 13% ahead of budget. By average temperature, April was the second coldest April in the post-war era, despite that the month finished on a warm trend. Year-to-date through April we are 9% up on 2022 and 32% ahead of budget.

May:

After a cold, wet April, May was very warm and dry in the Seattle area, it was the 2nd warmest May on record. May was a record setting month in 2023 in Range, Golf Course, Cart Rentals, and Food & Beverage! May finished 25% ahead of 2022 and 28% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, a stellar record year by all accounts.

June:

June was a record setting month in 2023 in Range, Golf Course, Cart Rentals, Pro Shop, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! June finished 20% ahead of 2022 and 20% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 6% ahead of what we once thought an unbeatable year!

July:

July was yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Range, Golf Course, Cart Rentals, Pro Shop and Total Overall Revenue! July finished 3% ahead of 2022, 8% ahead of 2021 and 16% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 6% ahead of what we once thought an unbeatable year!

August:

 August was yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Range, Golf Course, Cart Rentals, Pro Shop, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! August finished 6% ahead of 2022, 10% ahead of 2021 and 17% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 11% ahead of 2022 and 7% ahead of 2021.

September:

September was yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Range, Cart Rentals, Pro Shop, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! September finished 1% ahead of 2022, 13% ahead of 2021 and 12% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 10% ahead of 2022 and 8% ahead of 2021.

October:

 October was yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Pro Shop, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! October finished 1% ahead of 2022, 16% ahead of 2021 and 65% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 9% ahead of 2022 and 8% ahead of 2021.

November:

November was yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Driving Range, Food & Beverage, and Total Overall Revenue! November finished 7% ahead of 2022, 8% ahead of 2021 and 77% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 9% ahead of 2022 and 8% ahead of 2021 and 26% ahead of budget.

December:

December finished the year with yet another record setting month in 2023! Setting records in Driving Range, Lessons, Pro Shop, and Total Overall Revenue! Food and Beverage and Cart rentals also just missed out on setting new records! 2023 as a year set a record in every measurable category, a banner year that saw the facility cross the 5 million revenue mark for the first time! December finished 76% ahead of 2022, 56%

ahead of 2021 and 119% ahead of budget. YTD, we have even caught up with 2021, now 11% ahead of 2022 and 10% ahead of 2021 and 28% ahead of budget.

West Seattle Golf Course

Facility Highlights

- Set All-Time Revenue Records 11 of the 12 months in 2023.
- Surpassed \$3.7 million in revenue which is \$600,000 more than any other year.
- A two-year growth of more than \$1,000,000 since 2021
- The Banquet Hall alone brought in \$100,000 in Food, Beverage, Alcohol sales.
- The Beverage Cart was responsible for \$100,000 in revenue for the year.
- With the most app users, the West Seattle App was used to promote open tee times or merchandise specials and made more than \$32,000 in sales for the year.
- A total of 65,106 rounds of golf were played in 2023 and is 8,000 rounds more than last year and is the highest 18-Hole Round Count that we have had in the last 20 years:
 - Includes 12,558 rounds of discounted green fees for Senior Golfers
 - o Includes 5157 discounted green fees for Youth Golfers
 - 124 Free Rounds for the 'Kids Play Free' promotion.
 - 1,643 Rounds sold to kids in the 'Youth on Course' program for only \$5.
 - 1,847 Rounds of discounted green fees for college students
 - 1,000 Rounds of discounted green fees for high school team members
 - Includes 125 rounds of discounted green fees for Disabled / Military Golfers
 - Also fueling the successes outlined below are the affiliated member clubs at West Seattle GC. These dedicated, passionate golfers love their home course and shows throughout this report. With almost 1,000 members, West Seattle is the home of one of the largest clubs in the Pacific Northwest.
 - West Seattle Ladies Club 115 members played 1,700 tournament rounds and many more on a casual basis.
 - West Seattle Golf Club 800 members played 6,000 tournament rounds and countless 'for fun' non-competitive rounds.

Course

- Complete oil change in fleet of 63 golf carts
- Re-installed anti slip walking path on #7 and #12 bridge.
- Repaired broken railing on #12 bridge.
- Installed multiple drain lines on the course. Hole #14 greenside. Much of the length of hole #9 and #1 with additional catch basin cleanouts.
- Estimated cart repairs of \$6,000 was completed by Golf Course mechanic without having to send carts back to Yamaha for more expensive repairs which also takes the cart out of the fleet for weeks at a time.
- Water Conservation Rocky and I are focused on water conservation and being good stewards of the environment. We are always exploring how to better take care of this valuable resource. Here are the details of how we are conserving 800,000 gallons of

water and more than \$10,000 in expenses as outlined by our superintendent Rocky Tharp:

- "Colin and I went out and determined which fairways could be shortened without impacting golfers who are playing from the correct tees for their driving distance. We identified 8 fairways that we felt would be most impactful to our goal. Our crew then reconfigured the areas by a combination of turning off some heads, replacing some with part circle heads. All the new station data was then entered into the central control computer.
- We were able to turn off the equivalent of 36 heads for an annual savings of 823,000 gallons or approximately \$8,000 in water costs. The total area is approximately 2 acres so that will also produce a savings on wetting agents, fertilizer, and growth regulator that we won't need to apply (another \$2500 in savings per year).

Clubhouse

- The restaurant staff achieved the highest Food Safety Rating of 'Excellent'.
- New Carpet Tiles in the bar area installed.
- Clubhouse Surrounds: over 100 hours donated by the Ladies Club, Grady Irvin and Mike Joyce to care of flower beds, edging and planters.
- Restriped the parking lot savings of about \$4,500.

Expenses

- April \$7,000 unbudgeted expense for new patio furniture
- May \$2,500 unbudgeted expenses for restaurant equipment
- June \$3,500 unbudgeted expense for a new smoker in the restaurant.
- July \$2,500 unbudgeted expense for plumbing repairs in the Ladies 'front' bathroom.
- August \$2,900 unbudgeted expense to replace our freezer. Unfortunately, we also lost about \$500 in product as food waste when the freezer went down.
- September \$3,400 unbudgeted expense to rebuild our kitchen fire suppression system as required by the Fire Department.
- September \$1,500 unbudgeted expense to purchase hitting mats for the new warm up area that was opened last month.
- October unbudgeted expenses of \$2,000 for Roof and Gutter Cleaning, Clubhouse Door Repair and Plumbing expense for the locker room bathroom.
- Expense Savings:
 - June Sept expense savings of \$10,000 for the implementation of our water conservation plan outlines above in 'course report'.
 - Off Season \$12,000 savings in curtailing service visits of bathrooms, port-apots, garbage, recycling and boiler operational hours.

West Seattle - By the Month

- January:
 - Set a record for January 'total facility revenue'.
 - Average per player wallet share increased by \$5 over January 2022
 - o West Seattle Golf Club hosted two 'winter series' events:
 - 3-Club Event had 115 participants and brought in \$7,800
 - 2-Person Shamble had 124 players and brought in \$10,500
 - Colin Gants took 16 club members to Bandon Dunes. These 'travel' events are vital to building strong relationships with our most frequent customers.
 - o Added a new employee to the WSGC Staff Assistant Manager Luke Nevin
 - West Seattle Golf Club trip to Bandon Dunes



o February:

- Set an all-time revenue record for the 2nd month in a row.
- Rocky and his crew are devoting quite a few labor hours to improving the playability of WSGC in the Winter. His drainage projects are making a noticeable difference in round counts. Three years ago, WSGC was last among the Seattle courses in winter round counts - now we are #1.
- One day closed due to snow.
- West Seattle Golf Club 2-Person Scramble brought in \$7,500 and wasn't well attended because of the extreme cold temperatures on Sat Feb 26th (the day before our snow closure).
- The Banquet Hall was busy with 6 events which brought in \$4,500 in revenue.
- Volunteers donated 36 hours to beautifying our club house surrounds.



o March:

- o WSGC posted its highest March total facility revenue ever.
- The Banquet Hall hosted six events bringing in \$8,000 in revenue.
- West Seattle Golf Club 4 Person Scramble had 118 participants and brought in \$16,200 in revenue.
- o Colin Gants took a group of club members to a PGA Pro Am in Las Vegas.
- Used the West Seattle GC App to promote three 'play specials' bringing in \$3000.



o April:

- West Seattle set an all-time record for total facility revenue in April.
- The Banquet Hall hosted 5 events bringing in \$6000 in revenue.
- Rocky and his crew completed the Spring Aeration
- Hosted the Greater Seattle Women's Public Golf Association Tournament which brought in 48 players from eight different courses.
- Colin Gants took a team from West Seattle to compete against a team from California in an inter-state match - WSGC Won!
- Hosted a major NWAC Collegiate Tournament with 70 players from 11 different schools. We are very proud to show our course to these young student athletes.
- West Seattle App Promotion brought in 64 players and \$2000 in revenue.



May:

- WSGC set a record for total facility revenue in May.
- Hosted the Greater Seattle Women's Public Golf Association Presidents Cup bringing in 90 golfers. This fundraiser for Multiple Sclerosis raised \$3,000.
- Gallus Promotions we ran two promotions during the month helping boost revenue by \$2,000 including a Mother's Day Special.
- West Seattle Golf Club had 144 participants in Field Day bringing in \$18,500.
- West Seattle Ladies Club donated 33 hours to the upkeep of the flower beds.
- o Ladies Club conducted their planning retreat in the Banquet Hall.
- Banquet Hall had 6 events bringing in \$11,000 including:

- Live music in Banquet Hall performed by High School Students.
- Democratic Women of West Seattle



o June:

- West Seattle GC for the sixth month in a row posted record revenue for the entire facility.
- June is 'Women's Golf Month' and West Seattle GC celebrated all month:
 - Weekly Specials in the Restaurant
 - Colin Gants participated in two 'Ladies Only' PGA Pro Am's
 - Hosted a Ladies Only Short Game Clinic
 - Colin Gants taught a 2-hour free rules clinic for the Ladies Club
 - Pro Shop Specials for Ladies Merchandise
- Alpha Charity used our Banquet Hall for their annual fundraiser bringing in more money than they have in several years.
- Two events were conducted in conjunction with the West Seattle Golf Club and had more than 200 participants play bringing in \$16,000.
- Four West Seattle App promotions offered last minute promotions of green fees and Father's Day Merchandise discounts bringing in \$6,000 in revenue.
- Achieved an 'Excellent' rating for the Food Safety Rating
- Club Championship Qualifier for the West Seattle Golf Club.



July:

- July total facility revenue set a record (7 months in a row)
- West Seattle GC had the highest 18-hole round counts in Seattle for the seventh month in a row. July saw us average more than 300 golfers per day. West Seattle GC's popularity with its golfers is at an all-time high right now....but why?
 - Course conditions are some of the best in the Puget Sound area and the word is out that West Seattle GC is presented beautifully.
 - Pace of Play has improved dramatically over the prior year. We can pinpoint the reason for improvement to two applications:
 - Tag Marshal Software
 - Tee Time interval expansion the flow is so much better on the course without displacing any rounds of golf. In fact, we are hosting MORE rounds of golf.
 - Pro Shop and Restaurant Staff I am so pleased with how the entire staff is on the same page with generating rounds and revenue all the while delivering expert customer service with a smile. Our golfers love coming to West Seattle GC because there are a bunch of people that work here that love the course as much as they do.
- Beverage Cart sales surpassed \$20,000 in revenue Thank you Taryn!

- o Eight events in the Banquet Hall responsible for \$16,000 in additional revenue.
- o Mike Fosnick and Colin Gants gave a 'site tour' to the Troon Corporate Team
- Hosted the final round of the Seattle Amateur Championship Congratulations Dalton Conn the 2023 Seattle Amateur Champion.
- The biggest event of the year, West Seattle Amateur, attracted 164 players from 34 different courses around the Puget Sound area. Congratulations to Travis Bossio our 2023 Champ.
- Busy tournament / league / event month seeing more than 800 total players.
- West Seattle Ladies Club utilized the Banquet Hall for their Board of Directors meeting.
- A concentrated effort to add new App Users saw more than 1,000 new users added.



August:

 - Fueling the success is the capacity management by all of the staff.

 Expert tee sheet management that maximizes rounds all the while ensuring a better-than-expected pace of play and a consistent on-time first tee is the key to getting as many golfers on the course as possible.
- o There were 6 events in the Banquet Hall generating an extra \$4,000 in revenue.
- The West Seattle Golf Club won the Seattle Cup!

- A capital project to install a new warm up area approved by Patrick Merriam came to fruition addressing one of the concerns most important to our golfers.
- West Seattle Golf Club is excited to have two of their members as State Mixed Chapman Champions - Congratulations to Sammie Pless and Garrett Gants.

- The high school season is under way and we are hosting tryouts for five area schools.
- o Introduced a new 'alternative logo' for WSGC Fox remains #1 though.
- o Congratulations to Debbie Yee The 2023 Ladies Club Champion
- Used the WSGC app for targeted promotions bringing in \$5880 in revenue.

- Used the West Seattle App for a Pro Shop Promotion which brought in \$1,200 in merchandise sales.



October:

 year. Not often do we see both shoulder seasons with great weather this year

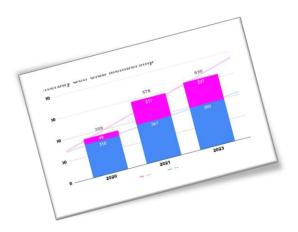

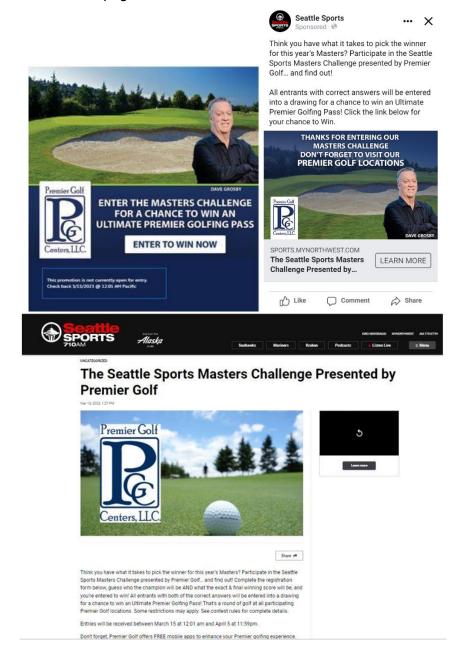

RESERVATION CENTER

In 2023, our Premier reservation center answered 123,087 total calls for premier, 52,407 of which were calls for the Seattle Golf Courses. The reservation center is a huge help to the course as they take calls off the front counter so they can more easily help face to face customers, they answer general questions, alert golfers to any course news and information, and help customers with their reservations, while giving them other Premier courses as option to play if the tee time they were looking for a specific course was taken. Cross bookings at the Seattle courses help bring in additional green fee revenue.

SAGACITY GOLF

In 2023, we continued to utilize Sagacity, a dynamic pricing platform for Jackson Park GC, Jefferson Park GC and West Seattle GC. Sagacity was developed to take the guesswork out of setting rates. It helps set the correct price, based on historical data and market demand. The platform is also able to look ahead to make sure the number of bookings is on track or if certain booking windows or individual tee times need more attention. In 2023, the price per golfer increased 3% at Jackson Park GC, 3% at Jefferson Park GC, and 4% at West Seattle GC over 2022. Also, the daily deals brought in an additional \$115,406 in combined revenue.

PLAYERS 1ST

We continued to utilize the Customer Experience Platform called Players' 1st. This platform is integrated with Club Prophet Systems, so we are able to automatically send Surveys to players within 24 hours of when they played their round. These surveys were very helpful to determine customer satisfaction and receive immediate feedback on areas that we could improve. We are notified by email of every survey taken so if the customer rated their visit poorly, we could contact them to learn more and work to resolve the issue. In turn, if the course & staff were rated highly, we could notify our staff of the great work they were doing to make that customer happy.

In 2023 we turned on the surveys for a month twice this year and the four Seattle courses received a combined 1,169 surveys. Below are a few quotes from customers.

Interbay GC:

What was the best part of your experience?

"Pretty great facility. Right size and time to complete round. Convenient location." "Friendly staff and beautiful course."

"The vibe. People are grateful to have such a great resource in their neighborhood."

"Love the top tracer and the ladies league"

"Staff are always great. I always walk on and they are very helpful and willing to accommodate me playing. Website does not allow us to book a single so I just ask when I arrive. If there is nothing available I hit a bucket instead. Everyone is so nice and helpful in general. Had irons regripped last week and it was super easy, affordable, and fast. Love Interbay. Fantastic operation and a key part of our neighborhood and city."

"Course was in nice shape and the cost was great."

What could we do to make your experience better?

"Explain golf etiquette on a handout when checking in. Giver each player a plastic ball marker tool."

"Try to vary pin placement and tee boxes more so holes aren't the same distance back-to-back. Even a ten-yard difference makes the course more fun!"

"Ladies room toilet has been broken for months and water pressure in sink does not allow you to wash your hands appropriately."

"Yardage on hole signs."

"Interbay as a whole is a Diamond in the rough. It's an incredible green space in the city, and is far and away the best practice facility in the greater area (minus local country clubs). It would be incredible if there were plans to improve and expand the practice area. A better chipping a bunker practice area is definitely a gap in the current offering. Other than that, the turf in the range is an eye sore and brings the sentiment of the facilities quality down significantly by regulars and new visitors. That should be fixed!"

Jackson Park GC:

What was the best part of your experience?

"Revisiting - it'd been m maybe 15 years since I played the course, had done so a few times before then. I had forgotten what a really good layout the four is, really enjoyed the two recent rounds there, would steer anyone there."

"The course was in the best shape I've ever seen over the 12 years I've been playing here. It was a busy day but we weren't rushed."

"Friendly clubhouse staff and starter--course is great!"

"It was my first time playing Jackson. I thought the course routing was fun, the greens were great condition, and the staff we're helpful."

"The staff, course architecture, and greens are great at Jackson - and these are probably 3 of the most important aspects of a golf course. The irrigation system added on 9 is a great improvement as it helps keep balls from rolling down onto 8. It is great that a lot of the excessive tree growth has been thinned out this year - it makes the course much more playable and fun and gives the grass better light so it can grow better. I definitely feel that the maintenance at Jackson Park is moving in the right direction."

What could we do to make your experience better?

"If you provide air compressor and high power water to wash golf shoes and cart."

"A few holes were missing signage of where to go after finishing the previous hole."

"The pace of play is unacceptable, it took us 3 hours to play 9 holes. You need to have rangers on the course, enforcing pace of play, and you need to spread out tee times 15 mins apart."

"Course condition is very poor for the cost especially with cart. Tee boxes and fairways in poor condition-rough is in poor condition."

"Many of the fairways have bare spots and weeds. I play all of the municipal courses in this area and, unfortunately, it seems Jackson Park has about the worst grass growth and weed control. The weeds with the white flowers are especially vexing since they make it hard to find your golf ball. This might be a good time to work on grass growth and to flatten the tee boxes while some of the tee boxes are moved forward from their traditional placement. Jackson is my favorite local course and if the conditions were better, I would have less incentive to play anywhere else."

Jefferson Park GC:

What was the best part of your experience?

"Convenient from home, very nice staff, great course condition."

"Always just a great vibe at Jefferson. Folks from desk to starter to player assist driving by; everyone sets a proper golf mood. And a young guy a few holes ahead with whom we'd been paired in late April took the time to come over and say hey. Like I said: a great vibe at Jefferson. Thanks!"

"Affordable pricing through the Daily Deals app. Good course conditions."

"Women's club is fun and inviting, course in great condition."

"Cesar salad was really tasty. Course is in excellent condition for the price."

What could we do to make your experience better?

"The fairways were hard as a rock. By summer they will be concrete! Water them! Get the back holes restored ASAP!"

"Mid-way restroom facilities. They were not well maintained or cleaned but have improved slightly in the past 2 weeks."

"Fix the fences on the back nine. Fix 11 and 12. Those holes are a joke."

"There needs to be food and drink options somewhere on the course during play. It is unreasonable for players to stop playing and have to travel back to the clubhouse in order to get food and drinks. Fix holes 11 & 12!"

"We hadn't played the course before and the signage was a bit lacking between some of the holes."

West Seattle GC:

What was the best part of your experience?

"The greens are fantastic. Amazing shape only a few weeks after punching."

"The course overall is in great shape. The area on the right side of fairways 1 and 9 (about halfway up the fairway around the sand trap on 1) that used to be a soggy mess until early June has been completely fixed. The drainage work done last year was a total success."

"I felt welcomed everywhere I went. I could feel that everyone was contributing to make the Event a success."

"Course was in excellent shape and staff was welcoming and professional"

"there was a ranger who actually took prompt action to address slow play early in our round; much appreciated"

What could we do to make your experience better?

"Seems to be a lack of ball washers on the course"

"Ladies rooms need an update...it is so tight that I heard someone bumped her knee."

"On the 13th tee box sign showing a map of green with yardage would be helpful. Such a huge difference in distances from the left side of green to the right side."

"Remind players when checking in and at the first tee to fix ball marks on the green and stay with the group ahead of you. Ready golf! We had a foursome in front of us that on the 15th tee box there was no one ahead of them. 2.5 holes behind. It's just considerate of all those behind them."

"Restore or replace the hitting cages. It was bad enough not having a range to warm up on, but now without the cages, there is nowhere to strike a ball prior to a round."

"More benches on course, larger patio area by restaurant. New bathroom"

Weather

Rainfall in 2023 was down significantly from the past several years, coming in at a 31.52" yearly total, 3.05" less than normal and 9.39" less than 2022. While only slightly below normal, as you can see from the numbers, 2023 had significantly less rain than the prior year.

2023 only brought 6 days over 90 degrees. The course maintenance crew had to meticulously monitor the irrigation system to assure the grass was properly hydrated. This often-necessitated hand watering throughout the day during the warm dry summer

Despite the weather, the course maintenance crew maintained the course and kept it playable throughout the year. In the Spring and Fall, the maintenance crew aerated the course to alleviate compaction caused by the 274,157 golfers that played in 2023.





Financial Reports

2023 saw an incredible increase of golf participation across the state as the weather was about as good as could be hoped for in Washington. The forecast was that after a record setting year in 2022 golf would see a significant decline in participation as the world started to open to more activities and social distancing requirements were relaxed. It was a pleasant surprise that the momentum of golf in Seattle carried into 2023 with participation reaching new record numbers that had been set in 2021. And a very strong year in 2022. The momentum of new golfers from the Covid era and improvements to the courses combined with a Spring that was drier than normal, a summer with very few hot days, and even the start of the off-season with some beautiful golf days made for a very successful 2023.

Revenue at the Seattle Golf Courses not only exceeded expectations for the year but set new Records across every department except mini golf. In a year with weather variables that crossed everything imaginable, golf remained strong in Seattle and the courses were not only able to retain the golfers they attracted during the Covid years but were able to add growth to Revenue numbers. Kudos to the team for a successful year.

Cost of Goods Sold (COGS) was carefully managed through tight inventory control coming in more than both budget and prior year expenses; however, this was to be expected with a revenue growth of over \$2,000,000. Operating expenses came in over budget and prior year primarily due to Payroll expenses as the course worked to retain top talent in a struggling labor market and the expenses associated with the technology transition that occurred in 2022 not being paid until 2023.

Golf Services Net Income came in above both budget and prior year, by 9% and 57% respectively. Profit over prior year was \$826,831, while profit over budget was \$3,475,131, outperforming all expectations for 2023.

Record Revenue was achieved in Range, Green Fees, Cart Rentals, Lessons, Pro Shop, and Food & Beverage as well as Overall Total Revenue for the Seattle Golf Courses!

The Profit and Loss statement for 2023 on the following pages outlines the historical Revenue performance and despite all best efforts to control expenses the economic impact on Payroll and Other Operating Expenses.

The golf shop needs a remodel to not only improve the overall appearance but to also improve merchandise sales. Currently customers come directly to the counter to check in without walking past most of the merchandise. A counter located near the admin office would force our customers to walk through all our displays, putting our merchandise directly in their eye line. This would also better help our staff keep an eye potential theft that takes place due to obstructed views of the golf shop. - Completion goal - 4/23 (Project approved and started on 1/9/2024)

Expanding the chipping and pitching practice area for our customers and instructors. This could be accomplished by shorting the 1st hole and using the tee box area to install a new chipping green/bunker area. With the large number of golfers who come to practice at Interbay this area is often overcrowded with people chipping balls to the same area others are putting and customers sitting outside to eat and drink. This constriction could result in injuries. This is a large project, but we wanted to float the idea out there.

- Complete oil change in fleet of 63 golf carts
- Re-installed anti slip walking path on #7 and #12 bridge.

- Estimated cart repairs of \$6,000 was completed by Golf Course mechanic without having to send carts back to Yamaha for more expensive repairs which also takes the cart out of the fleet for weeks at a time.
- Water Conservation Rocky and I are focused on water conservation and being good stewards
 of the environment. We are always exploring how to better take care of this valuable resource.
 Here are the details of how we are conserving 800,000 gallons of water and more than \$10,000
 in expenses as outlined by our superintendent Rocky Tharp:
 - "Colin and I went out and determined which fairways could be shortened without impacting golfers who are playing from the correct tees for their driving distance. We identified 8 fairways that we felt would be most impactful to our goal. Our crew then reconfigured the areas by a combination of turning off some heads, replacing some with part circle heads. All the new station data was then entered into the central control computer.
 - We were able to turn off the equivalent of 36 heads for an annual savings of 823,000 gallons or approximately \$8,000 in water costs. The total area is approximately 2 acres so that will also produce a savings on wetting agents, fertilizer, and growth regulator that we won't need to apply (another \$2500 in savings per year).

- The restaurant staff achieved the highest Food Safety Rating of 'Excellent'.
- New Carpet Tiles in the bar area installed.
- Clubhouse Surrounds: over 100 hours donated by the Ladies Club, Grady Irvin and Mike Joyce to care of flower beds, edging and planters.
- Restriped the parking lot savings of about \$4,500.
