MEETING NOTES

Present

Seattle Parks and Recreation (SPR) Staff, Karimah Edwards, Seattle Parks and Recreation Planner Community Members – Approximately 40 community members stopped by for the May 13th event.

Summary

Karimah greeted participants and explained the project schedule, budget and planning process. This meeting was conducted as an open house/pop-up presentation which included boards with graphics. Participants reviewed the images and used dot stickers to select the park elements they would like to see in the new park. Using pictures and holding it onsite made it accessible for a diverse group of participants. Many participants voiced questions and concerns related to the project but also shared their ideas. Several community members from the surrounding neighborhood which included students, families and property managers were in attendance.

Schedule: The project is currently in the planning phase. Design will be completed by 2018 with construction planned for 2019.

- More lighting, park feels unsafe
- Illegal camping, drugs and other negative activity has been observed around wall
- More garbage receptacles will be needed if park is used more
- Picnics should be relocated to discourage negative activity
