What one word or phrase would you use to describe what you like best about Lowman Beach Park?














# What We Heard: Existing Features

On a scale from 1 to 5, where 1 means "extremely important" and 5 means "not important at all", how important is it to provide a new racket court at Lowman Beach Park?



















### Concept 1: Full Size Multi-Sport Court













### Concept 2B: Medium Size Court + No Swings




