Calling 9-1-1

When to Call 9-1-1

- Report all crime in progress and suspicious activity to the Seattle Police Department by calling 9-1-1.
- Let the call-taker guide the conversation.
- Try to stay calm and answer their questions.
- As long as it is safe, stay on the phone until the call-taker tells you to hang up.
- If the crime has already happened, the danger is over and no one is injured, you can call the non-emergency **206-625-5011** number.
- Property crimes can be reported online.

What the Call Taker May Ask

- What is the exact location of the emergency? Try to give an address or cross street.
- What is happening?
- Are you safe?
- What did the suspect(s) do?
- What does the suspect look like? Describe from the top down.
- Are there any vehicles involved? Try to describe them.
- Were there any weapons displayed?

Key Tip:

If you accidentally call 9-1-1, do not hang up! Wait for the call-taker and explain you misdialed.
