## **Avoiding ID Theft**

#### **Common ID Theft Tactics Used**

- Stealing your mail to get account numbers.
- Asking for personal info on the phone or email.
- Stealing account numbers from a business.
- Stealing your wallet or purse to get information.

#### Ways to Lower Your Risk

- Watch your wallet and keep track of cards.
- Do not tell or show people your PIN.
- Use passwords that are hard to guess.
- Do not put personal information on computers in public spaces, like the library.
- Keep your financial records, Social Security and Medicare cards in a safe place.
- Shred papers that have your personal or medical information.
- Take mail out of the mailbox as soon as possible.

#### **Check Regularly**

- Review bills and account statements for unusual charges.
- Get your credit report and look for new accounts or incorrect information.
