	Adding public comment per Rene:	<ul> <li>Alarm that the large number of removals wasn't discussed with CSWG / weren't notified.</li> <li>Lack of clarity on the reasoning behind the removals (deprecation, change in definition of classification, etc).</li> <li>Worry that removal from list means that these technologies won't be subject to certain audits/reviews / Annual Surveillance Usage Review or will be moved out of City Council purview.</li> </ul>
