Path of Travel Improvements in Alterations to
Existing Buildings
Release Date: May 8, 2009

The following interpretation, policy or code alternate is intended to provide guidance to staff for consistency of review and is subject to change without notice. Application of this interpretation, policy or code alternate to specific projects may vary.

Code Issue:

What improvements to the accessible path of travel are required for alterations to an existing building?

Interpretation &Policy:

Any alterations, by themselves, must comply with the new construction provisions of the code, subject to the exceptions in Section 3407.6 and 3407.7.

If the alteration affects an area of primary function, then the route to the area of primary function must be made accessible. The cost of making the route accessible need not exceed 20% of the cost of the alterations that affect the area of primary function. For these improvements to the accessible route, DPD's policy is to require the applicant to address accessibility in the following three areas, **in no order of priority**:

- 1) Interior accessibility through the existing space (ramps, elevators, lifts, etc.)
- 2) Main entry accessibility (ramps, lifts, etc.)
- 3) Accessible restrooms

If any or several of these improvements can be done for less than 20% of the cost of the project, those improvements will be required. If there are no improvements that can be done for less than 20% of the cost of the project, no improvements will be required.

Note that in the IBC, whether a project is a substantial alteration does not affect accessibility requirements.
