

8TH AVE MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS

New protected bike lanes and signal upgrades in downtown Seattle can improve safety for everyone and provide critical pieces of the center city bike network.

Installation of protected bike facilities on 8th Ave between Pike St and Bell St, and Pine St between 8th Ave and 6th Ave, will be completed over two weekends: August 3-4 and August 10-11, weather permitting.

8TH AVE MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS

Installation of bike facilities, signal upgrades begins as soon as August 3

OVERVIEW

We're installing new bike facilities over two weekends: August 3-4 and August 10-11, weather permitting. Some work may occur during the week of August 5, but it will not impact traffic.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING INSTALLATION

Weekend of August 3-4

- Grinding off old pavement markings
- Striping lanes and adding signage
- Directing traffic with flaggers and police
- Maintaining access to driveways and alleys

Weekend of August 10-11:

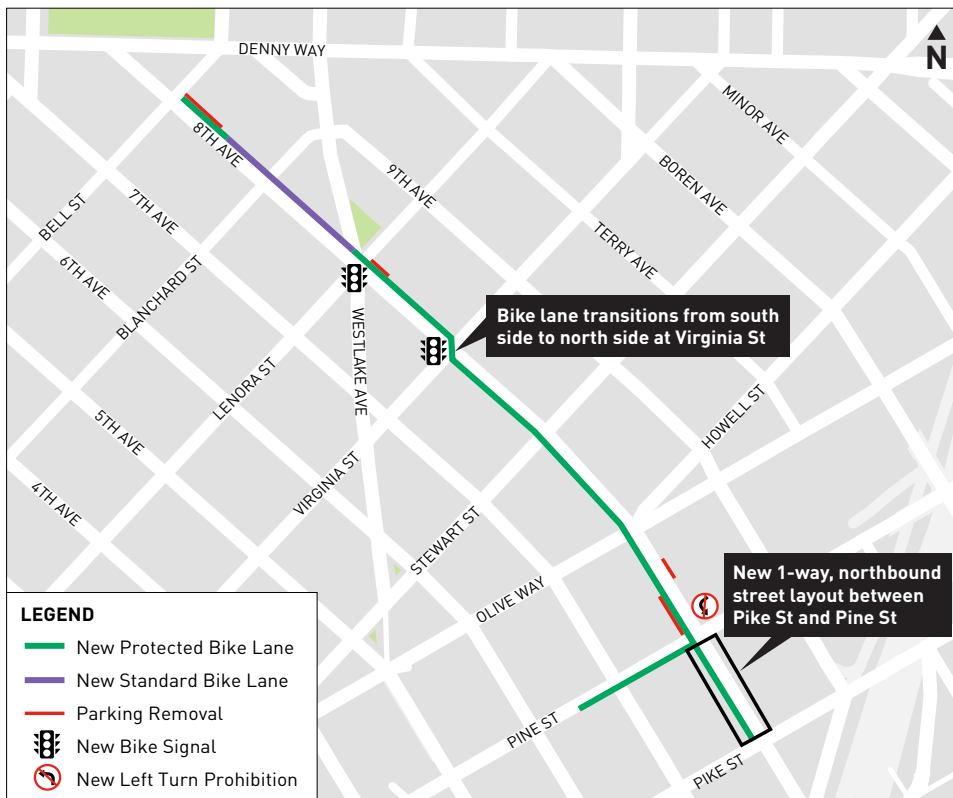
- Adding pavement markers, lane and buffer striping, and green material
- Installing posts
- Directing traffic with flaggers and police
- Maintaining access to driveways and alleys

Driveway/alley access

Areas where the bike lane intersects with driveways will be identified with green pavement markings. We'll install the green material on one half of the driveway at a time to maintain access.

During installation, be safe in work zones:

- Reduce speeds
- Use caution
- Keep a safe distance from construction equipment and workers
