Installation of protected bike facilities on Pike St between 9th Ave and Broadway will be completed over two weekends: September 7-8 and September 14-15, weather permitting.

# PIKE ST MOBILITY IMPROVEMENTS

## Installation of bike facilities, signal upgrades begins as soon as September 7

### OVERVIEW

We're installing new bike facilities over two weekends: September 7-8 and September 14-15, weather permitting. We will begin laying out new striping before installation begins. Some work may occur during the weeks of September 2 and 9, but it will not impact traffic.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING INSTALLATION

#### Weekend of September 7-8

- Grinding off old pavement markings
- Striping lanes and adding signage, green material, and signals
- Directing traffic with flaggers and police
- Maintaining access to driveways and alleys
- Adjusting parking and load zones

#### Weekend of September 14-15:

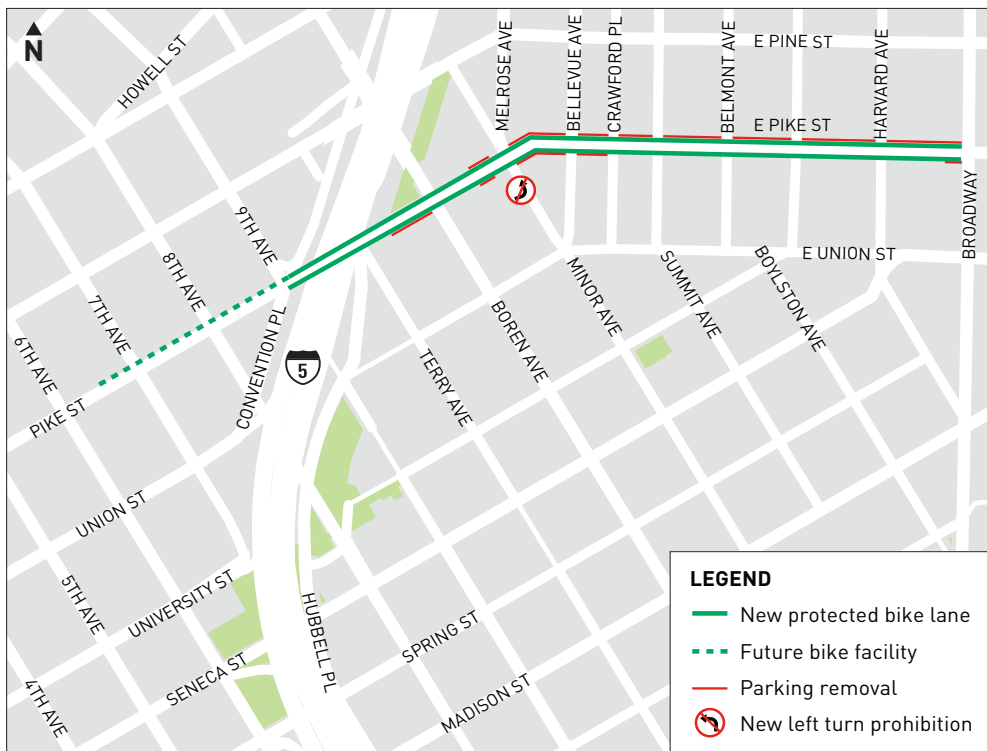
- Adding remaining pavement markers and green material
- Installing posts
- Directing traffic with flaggers and police
- Maintaining access to driveways and alleys

#### Driveway/alley access

Areas where the bike lane intersects with driveways will be identified with green pavement markings. We'll install the green material on one half of the driveway at a time to maintain access.

#### During installation, be safe in work zones:

- Reduce speeds
- Use caution
- Keep a safe distance from construction equipment and workers
