CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Beacon Ave S & 15th Ave S Safety Project Construction begins as early as July

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Our project was guided by Seattle's Vision Zero plan to prevent serious collisions by designing safer streets. This project will help manage driver speeds and encourage more walking and biking.

During construction, you will see us working on the following tasks:

- We will repair sections of the sidewalk near intersections along the entire route.
- We will add pedestrian push buttons to each crossing at S Hanford St & Beacon Ave S and at the south and west crossings of 15th Ave S & S College St.
- To improve accessibility, we will add 35 new ramps, allowing people who use wheels to travel safely between Dr. Jose Rizal Bridge and S Spokane St.
- We will install concrete-protected bike lanes on both sides of 15th Ave S.
- On both sides of Beacon Ave S, we will install post-protected bike lanes.
- At the intersections of S Charles St & Golf Dr S, 15th Ave S & S College St, and 15th Ave S & Beacon Ave S, we will add bike signals.
- We will build bus stop islands on both sides of Beacon Ave S at S Hanford St and outside of the Beacon Hill Link Light Rail Station.

PROJECT TIMELINE

We expect construction to run from July 2024 through spring 2025.

During construction, you can expect the following:

- We will be working from Monday to Friday, starting at 7:00 A.M. and finishing at 5:00 P.M.
- We may need to temporarily change the traffic flow to accommodate the construction work.
- There will be temporary restrictions on parking.
- Some of the work activities might be noisy. This includes using backup alarms for safety, heavy vehicles, and power tools.
