Committed to 6 core values:



Project purpose

The **purpose** of the Beacon Hill Bike Lane project is to create bicycle facilities that connect people to businesses and community destinations in Beacon Hill

Create a safe and comfortable place for people to ride to get where they want to go


Creates connections between existing bike routes like the Columbian Way PBL, Myrtle PBL, the Chief Sealth Trail, neighborhood greenways and the future PBL on 12th Ave S



Project needs

Beacon Hill has been identified as a highpriority corridor for meeting the following transportation and community **needs**:

- Contribute to City's Vision Zero goal to end traffic deaths and serious injuries
- Provide a better north/south bike connection in southeast Seattle
- Improve pedestrian and bicycle safety and connections to transit



Project highlights

- New bike connection to connect to businesses and community resources in Beacon Hill.
- Segment 1: Dr. José Rizal Bridge to S Spokane: Connects to the North Beacon Hill Neighborhood. Evaluating the routing for this piece of the project.
- Segment 2: S Spokane to S Myrtle: Goes by Jefferson Park and connects along the center median through central Beacon Hill
- Segment 3; S Myrtle to S 39th: South Beacon Hill. Upgrade the center median path to make it pleasant for everyone.


Project area

The Beacon Hill Bike Route will be located along the ridge of Beacon Hill. The project will be broken into three **segments** along Beacon Ave S:

Segment 1: Dr. José Rizal Bridge to S Spokane St

Segment 2: S Spokane St to S Myrtle St

Segment 3: S Myrtle St to 39th St S






Example of a Protected Bike Lane













Potential Bus Stop Treatments










