



Stairway replacement at Aurora Ave N and Raye St

PROJECT UPDATE

To improve pedestrian safety and accessibility, Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) crews are replacing the stairways on the east and west sides of Aurora Ave N at Raye St.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements include:

- Replacing the existing stairs with a new stairway made of reinforced concrete, with even heights for each step
- Installing new handrails on each side, with a second handrail at a lower height to accommodate adults and children

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

Work is scheduled for early April through early June, depending on weather. The stairways will be closed during most of the work. Please follow the posted detour route.

We appreciate your patience during this work.



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Typical work hours between 7 AM and 3:30 PM on weekdays
- During demolition (approx. 5 days), flaggers will direct traffic around the work zone on Raye St
- Intermittent lane restrictions at top and bottom of stairway during work
- Some noisy work activity including digging and backup alarms required for safety
- Pedestrian detour around the work zone

This project is funded by the 9-year Levy to Move Seattle, approved by voters in 2015.
