

Speed feedback signs

- All installed last weekend
- May or may not have been turned on and checked yet (at this time of this meeting)
- We will look to collect additional speed data in a month to determine effectiveness





Highland Park Way/West Marginal Way intersection


• Install new markings in 2020 (new right turn lane and left turn restriction)





Highland Park Way/West Marginal Way intersection

- Relocation of Metro bus stop through interim and permanent improvements
- Interim asphalt bus stop in 2020, Permanent sidewalk/ADA ramps built in early 2021





Longhouse signal updates


- SDOT is committed to pay for the interim and permanent signal construction
 - Reconnect West Seattle interfund loan
- Interim is scheduled for construction Summer 2021
 - Challenges: BNSF permitting, utility coordination
- Still ironing out final estimates for interim and permanent installation





Pedestrian Access and Walkway

- Cost-efficient pedestrian walkway on the west side of the street
- Likely to be funded by Reconnect West Seattle interfund loan
- SDOT Urban Forestry is reviewing current dirt path for pedestrian tree limb trimming (vertical clearance)
- Goal would be to install in Spring 2021





Freight mobility improvements

- SDOT has considered a Freight and Access to Business (FAB) lane in the northbound east lane
- After discussion with the Port and West Marginal businesses SDOT will likely look to other freight treatments






Protected bike lane (PBL)


- SDOT is considering a protected bike lane on West Marginal
- Convert southbound west travel lane into a 2-way protected bike lane
- Complete the missing link in Duwamish River Trail
- Minimal impacts to existing traffic flows
 - 80% of southbound traffic already use east (inner) lane
