CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

17th Ave SW closed for roadway repairs and paving

as early as Monday, March 7

Crews working for the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will make pavement repairs on 17th Avenue SW south of Myrtle Street as early as Monday, March 7 from 7:30 AM to 5 PM.

Crews will demolish a 10-foot section of the roadway and repair the area in the same day. This repair work will include asphalt pouring, during which time vehicles will not be permitted to travel through the work area. The asphalt cures in about 3 hours after pouring, at which time vehicles may resume normal travel through the area.

Prior to the start of asphalt pouring, you are advised to park on streets north of the work zone so that you are able to travel freely around the area during work hours. Local access will be maintained at all times except for during the asphalt pour time.

This work is weather dependent and subject to delays.

Project Information

This work is part of the Delridge-Highland Park Neighborhood Greenway Project that will connect White Center to the West Seattle Bridge Trail. The greenway will run north-south, generally along 17th Ave SW in the south and 21st Ave SW in the north.

Greenways are residential streets made safer and more comfortable for people of all ages and abilities to walk and ride bikes.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Weekday work hours of 7:30 AM to 5 PM
- Parking restrictions
- Limited roadway access
- Moderate construction noise, dust and vibrations
- Pedestrian and bike detours around the work zone
- Local access will be maintained when possible
