
PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Ashworth Ave N neighborhood greenway will enhance safe access for students walking and biking to school. The Most Promising Route connects Northgate Elementary School and Ingraham High School along Ashworth Ave N and N 120th St. In the future the route could be expanded to provide connections with Interurban trail and other community destinations.

GREENWAY DESIGN ELEMENTS

Slower Speeds and Stop Signs

- Calm traffic entering and crossing the greenway
- Drivers are better able to stop and prevent collisions




Safer Crossings at Busy Streets

- Easier for seniors and children to cross
- Make motorists aware of people walking and biking



Speed Humps

- Slow motorists and people riding bikes
- Reduce cut-through traffic



Neighborhood Activation

- Promote and activate public spaces
- Provide opportunity for greenery, parklets, and public spaces outside your door



Wayfinding

- Identify the street as a Neighborhood Greenway so people know what to expect
- Point the way to neighborhood destinations like parks, businesses, and other greenways
