NORTHGATE NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY Selected Route

March 2018

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Northgate Neighborhood Greenway came from city planning efforts and community requests. The Bicycle Master Plan calls for a network of neighborhood greenways in the Maple Leaf neighborhood that connect to schools and neighborhood destinations. With the opening of the Northgate Link light rail station in 2021, this neighborhood greenway was identified as a high priority for northeast Seattle.

WHAT'S A NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAY?

Neighborhood greenways are safer, calmer residential streets for you, your family, and neighbors. We make people walking and biking the priority.

Neighborhood greenways can include:

- Easier crossings of busy streets with crosswalks, flashing beacons, or traffic signals
- Speed humps to calm traffic
- Stop signs for side streets
- 20 mph speed limit signs
- Signs and pavement markings to help people find their way

WHAT WE HEARD

We've been working with people in the Northgate, Pinehurst, and Maple Leaf communities since spring 2017 to select a route for a new neighborhood greenway to be built as soon as 2020.

Hundreds of people gave feedback via an online survey, public events, and conversations with the project team.

We heard requests for a neighborhood greenway with:

- Connections to Maple Leaf Reservoir Park, Northgate Library and Community Center, nearby shopping, and the future Link Light Rail station
- Neighborhood traffic calming
- Safer crossings at busy intersections
- Routes that avoid the steepest hills



INSTALLATION PHASING

Maple Leaf Connection

The southern part of the neighborhood greenway will connect people in Northgate and Maple Leaf to Link light rail, Maple Leaf Reservoir Park, Northgate Mall, and the Northgate Community Center and Library. We'll upgrade intersections at 5th Ave NE & NE 103rd St and at Roosevelt Way NE & NE 103rd St to help people walking and biking cross as safely as possible. Construction anticipated as soon as 2020.

Pinehurst Connection

The northern part of the neighborhood greenway provides a north-south connection for people walking and biking between Northgate and Pinehurst, ending at Hazel Wolf K-8 School. New crossing improvements at NE 117th St & Roosevelt Way NE and additional traffic signaling at NE Northgate Way & 8th Ave NE will make it easier for people to cross these intersections. Construction anticipated as soon as 2021.
