CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

JOHN AND THOMAS CORRIDOR CROSSING IMPROVEMENTS

Construction starting as soon as July 9

As soon as July 9*, we'll start construction in the John and Thomas Corridor area. During this work, we'll install:

- New curb bulbs; these will be a mix of concrete and painted curb bulbs with white plastic posts
- New bus bulbs at some existing transit stops
- New marked crosswalks
- New pedestrian crossing beacons at E John St and 10th Ave E

In areas where new bus bulbs and curb bulbs will be installed, some existing parking may be removed. At E Olive Way at Summit Ave, the roadway will be permanently reduced to one lane in this segment of the road for the new bus bulb.

Work description and schedule

In some areas, crews will divide work into segments, starting with the southside of the street.

E THOMAS & 21ST AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant concrete curb bulbs and sidewalk

DATES: Early July to early August

E THOMAS & 20TH AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant concrete curb bulbs and sidewalk and landscaping improvements

SOUTHSIDE DATES: Mid-July to early September, with landscaping improvements taking place during planting season later in the fall

NORTHSIDE DATES: Late August to mid-September

E THOMAS & 19TH AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant concrete curb bulbs and sidewalk, and bus bulbs

SOUTHSIDE DATES: Late July to late August

NORTHSIDE DATES: Early September to early October

E THOMAS & 16TH AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant concrete curb bulbs and sidewalk, bus bulbs, and a bus stop

SOUTHSIDE DATES: Early August to early September

NORTHSIDE DATES: Mid-September to early October

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Typical construction hours on weekdays, 7 AM–3 PM
- Temporary lane, crosswalk, and sidewalk closures
- Detours for people walking and biking
- Parking and loading restrictions
- Noise, dust, truck activity, and vibrations
- * Construction schedule is subject to change

E OLIVE WAY & SUMMIT AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant curb ramps, a marked crosswalk, bus bulbs, and a bus stop

DATES: Late September to late October

E JOHN ST & 10TH AVE E

WORK: Installation of ADA-compliant concrete curb bulbs and sidewalk, bus bulbs, a bus stop, and Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs)

DATES: Early October to late November
